## FROM THE SUPERVISOR'S DESK

A lot has happened since the last newsletter - or so it seems. The first thing and the thing on most peoples minds is the National Fuel Compressor that NFG want to put in between Beach Ridge Rd. and Aiken Rd. It is a 22,000 Horse Power Compressor or two 11,000 Horse Power compressors. The concerns, to name a few are the chemical pollution from the compressors and the noise from them along with a host of other safety concerns. Why is building this compressor (s) needed? National Fuel needs to push low-pressure gas into the high-pressure line that feeds Canada and other parts of New York State. For years Canada shipped gas to the United States

through these lines when we were short of gas. Now with all the gas that we have from the Marcellus shale area the tables have turned and they want to ship gas to Canada for sale. The hard part that concerns us all is that is that they want to put these big compressors in Pendleton. The worst part of the whole situation is that the area that they want to put them in is residential and not industrial! After taking a trip to see a smaller one in the town of Wales I'm convinced that it does not belong in a residential area. This area is not zoned for industrial. You may have seen the meeting that was held at Wendelville Fire Hall on TV. We had about 350 people of every age, gender and educational background show up to voice their concerns and objections to this compressor station. We *will continue* fighting the placement of this compressor station in a residential area. I expect we will be hiring an expert environmental lawyer soon to help us out with the legal part of this whole mess. If you would like to help in some way you can call Paula Hargreaves at 625-6971 or Kim Lemieux at 625-6962. They are the leaders of the Pendleton Action Team that is working with the town board to resolve this problem.

**Late arrival!!** See article in newsletter headed "Stop National Fuel Compressor" for more ways to help.

We also this quarter filed the paperwork for the government efficiency program that means the taxpayers will get a check for some amount of the taxes saved this year. It is not really clear to me how much to expect it seemed to hinge on a few things. One requirement was for the town to have a plan to reduce taxes 1% each year for the next 3 years. Savings measures that we were already doing such as shared services with other Town's Highway Departments did not count nor did shared services with the Starpoint School System, and could not be used either. It had to be something that we started after January 2012. One cost saver that we started in 2013 did the trick! It is the new recycling program! This endeavor counted and we have been saving about \$30,000 a year. We had to show savings of \$13,000 dollars a year so this new program covers it nicely.

Just an update on the Historical society building.... we received a ballpark figure from the engineer of about \$187,000 to replace the log cabin that is deteriorating. This is for

approximately 1000 square feet. Sounds like a lot and it is, it is a function of having to bid prevailing wage to do projects in New York State. We did have an engineer look at the building to make sure that it is safe for the time being. He suggested that we move some material from the attic and to watch for any changes but does feel it is safe for now. We certainly don't want anyone getting hurt going to a meeting there. We are looking into a variety of solutions right now and we will keep you posted.

We are in the process of updating the water meter readers so we can read the meters from the road as in the past. I talked about the meter reader last quarter and we did get through another read but more and more meters are going bad and need to be replaced. The good news is that we have the meters and just need to put them in. We had 1560 that needed to be replaced and we already have replaced about 100, only 1460 to go! Sounds like a big job - and you're right!

Time for some good news...all looks good on the budget front. Things seem to be staying in line so far. Last year we cut the town taxes down to less than a \$100,000; maybe on the anniversary of the imposition of this tax we can eliminate it... stay tuned.

Congratulations to Wendelville Fire Company on taking delivery of a new ambulance this past quarter. The old one was almost 16 years old and didn't owe them anything. The new ambulance is beautiful inside and is a great ride. Here's hoping that few folks in the town get to see the inside that closely.

Congratulation to Cheri Enright of our town on publishing her new book "Riley and Me". It is a children's bedtime story, which she enjoyed making up for her children and now shares with us all. Certainly many creative people call Pendleton home!

## STOP NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPRESSOR

If you haven't heard by now, National Fuel wants to replace pipeline that runs along Beach Ridge Road. The current 16" gas pipeline will be replaced with a 24" high-pressure pipeline. In addition, National Fuel wants to build a 22,000 horsepower compressor station with access from Aiken Road. **The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) may still be accepting public comments. You can file an eComment by visiting the <http://www.ferc.gov/docs-filing/ecomment.asp> website using Docket # CP15-115.** FERC will have National Fuel respond to questions asked by the community. However, they prefer to have data and



**WATER/SEWER DEPARTMENT**

We have 1,560 water readers to replace within the town. The older style reader is no longer compliant by the FCC regulations and the life expectancy of these older readers are nearing their limits. In most cases it will take only five minutes to change the reader out and we will not have to interrupt your water service. We will be calling you or tagging your door to set up an appointment. Please feel free to give us a call at 716-625-8033 for arrangements. Also, just a reminder that all readers are attached to the water meter. They are no longer attached to the outside of your home.

For everyone who has a fire hydrant nearby or in their yard, it would be greatly appreciated if you could help keep the grass and weeds trimmed. If you have a flower bed around the hydrants, please keep growth trimmed as well. Fire hydrants need to be clearly visible and accessible for obvious reasons. We cannot be responsible for any damage that occurs to plants and flowers while performing our routine maintenance. Therefore, we do not recommend putting a flowerbed around the hydrants.

Also, please remember that before any digging or earth removal occurs, you must call Dig Safely New York at 811 or 1-800-962-7962 or online at [www.digsafelynewyork.com](http://www.digsafelynewyork.com). Dig Safely New York takes stake out request calls 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, free of charge. This is a law in New York State.

In the past six months we have had a lot of grinder pump issues in regards to heavy grease build ups. This grease build up causes problems with the on/off floats on the pump. Grease on the floats does not allow them to turn on and off properly. We have also had many calls with jammed pumps. Please do not flush any feminine products, baby wipes, clothing, plastics, q-tips, etc. that will enter the tank. These objects will jam the grinder pump causing costly system repairs. As always, the Town of Pendleton Sewer Department appreciates your continuous efforts to prevent objects and grease from entering the sewer system by being conscious of these issues. You will help save on costly system repairs.

The open house included participation from the Niagara County Sheriff's Office, Shawnee Fire Company, and Mercy Flight, including a landing of one of Mercy Flight's helicopters on Wendelville's ball field.

The Wendelville Fire Company provides fire, rescue, and emergency medical service to the entire Town of Pendleton. Our membership is comprised of your neighbors – men and women with experience ranging from 60 plus years of service to new members just starting out. On another note, the Fire Company membership is excited that during May we put into service a new ambulance, allowing us to retire our old unit that is about sixteen years old. Wendelville provides ambulance transport service at the Basic Life Support (BLS) level, with our ambulance responding to approximately 400 calls each year. Within our ranks we have members willing to commit the time necessary to maintain certification as a NYS EMT, allowing the Fire Company to continue to provide this ambulance service to the Town of Pendleton.

Recently, Wendelville Fire Company began its yearly road collection campaign with a mailing going-out to all addresses in the Town of Pendleton. We rely on the generous support offered by so many, making purchases like our new ambulance possible, in addition to the many expenses associated with operating an organization the size of Pendleton's only fire company. **HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT**

Hello, Well it has been an above-average May for temperature and below average for rainfall. I am willing to bet it will be that way the rest of the year – LOL! I try not to out think Mother Nature so let's see what she has in mind!

It has been a nice, slow start to the season, but very steady for us. In the spring my four guys plus our mechanic have to prep the parks and cemeteries. There were days when all five guys were needed to get the ball seasons started. Until we get our two summer helpers started it is difficult to concentrate on many other jobs.

As far as chipping brush goes, we chip when we can and the same goes for picking up stumps, other than telling you we try to get through the town twice a month, I can no longer give a schedule. I cannot commit two guys to this and also get our other work done. It generally takes all five men to do many of our jobs, including roadside ditch cleaning, installing pipe for driveways for new homes and any rotted, old pipe repairs and plugs. We will stop chipping brush after July 4<sup>th</sup> and get back out the week before Labor Day so we can concentrate on those other jobs.

By the time the newsletter is out we should have

gotten through the town once mowing our roadside ditches. We go through early in the year once on the shoulder and the ditch itself and then in the fall we do it again and also mow the backside of the ditch. At some point at the end of summer or fall we will mow as many off road ditches as we can depending on how wet they are and time constraints.

I am still evaluating roads and maintenance projects at this time. I always like to crack seal as many roads as I can. This keeps water from trickling down into the base. When the water gets through to the base it leads to more violent freezing that leads to breaks and crumbling and pot holes. It has been a very good preventative maintenance for us so far and it costs approximately \$6,000 per mile as an average. Last year I over spent the labor line, which was \$66,000 to maintain all of our town roads for my entire crew. That was without any "major" projects. This year I will be as careful as I possibly can be, but you can see that it is nearly impossible!
