From the desk of Legislator Tony Nemi

It's been a busy summer here in Niagara County, and county government has been no exception. The county will begin extensive reconstruction work on Feigle Road this coming spring—an issue that

Pendleton Highway Superintendent Jeff Stowell urged me to make a top priority for county government this year.

Likewise, I'm pleased to report that last month, the Niagara River Greenway Commission approved funding for a new canoe and kayak launch and floating dock at the West Canal Marina. This county park has long been an underdeveloped and underutilized asset; I'm working with the County Parks to change that. This canoe launch is a positive step toward that goal, and something a lot of town residents had indicated to me that they want. This will increase public access to the Tonawanda Creek and the Erie Canal and provide a good and safe access point for our canoers and kayakers.

Of course, when I've spoken with town residents, no issue has generated more conversation—and concern—than the proposed National Fuel gas compressor. In May, I sent a letter to the chairman of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission expressing my concerns about the project and its potential for harming the public and the environment; in mid-June, he personally responded to me. FERC is quite aware of the public opposition, FERC Chairman Norman Bay even noted in his letter that “over 300 residents attended the (May 20 public scope meeting)

and over 50 oral comments were received.”

The letter I received from FERC also said “All comments received in this proceeding, including noise issues, public safety, property value, and potential impacts on the former Frontier Chemical Landfill site, will be consider and analyzed in the Environmental Assessment to be produced by Commission staff.”

You can add the Niagara County Legislature to groups that have formally opposed the National Fuel gas line compressor; a resolution I introduced calling for an independent study of the compressor station passed unanimously at the Legislature's Aug. 4 meeting. Hours after I joined many neighbors from Pendleton at a picket outside National Fuel's headquarters, the County Legislature went on the record expressing its grave concerns over the project and urging the kind of independent review many of you are asking for. Niagara County clearly learned the lesson of turning a blind eye to environmental problems with Love Canal, and I'm proud my colleagues joined me to vocally oppose this compressor.

As we head into the new year, I want to urge all of you to take advantage of some of the community services the county will be involved in here in Pendleton.

If you are a senior, or know a senior who should be taking advantage of our Office for the Aging's Lunch program, I'd love to see you the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of every month at The Pendleton United Methodist Church, corner of Campbell Boulevard and Bear Ridge Road. Office for the Aging provides classes on fitness, nutrition, and senior benefits. For more information, call Bonnie at 418-4143.

TOWN HISTORIAN

When the colony of New York was created, before there were any farms, buildings, roads, or even the canal, there was nothing but unblemished wilderness covering the land that would become Pendleton. The early settlers of the colony, along with the other New England colonies, were under the control of the Crown, and that meant they had to support his endeavors. Which at this time meant help build up the naval fleet, so the British Navy could continue to dominate the waters. In order for a boat to be impressive and fast, it had to have a massive mast. The most popular trees for this were the White Pine trees, and as England had depleted most of their forest by this time, they exported the pines out of the colonies. As I previously mentioned, New York, and especially Niagara County was untouched and was literally full of massive trees. The King had a group of special surveyors that were designated to find and pick out the best trees that New York had to offer, and quite a few came out of the area that is now Pendleton. When the surveyors found a tree that they liked, they would mark it with the 'Kings Broad Arrow' which was 3 strikes of an axe that formed an arrow.

The earliest official settlers in Pendleton were Martin Van Slyke and Jacob Crosman, on Tonawanda Creek in about 1807-8, and only a few others joined them. After the War of 1812, then the population began to

increase at a steadier rate, and a big wave came around the 1820's with Sylvester Pendleton Clark not settling until around 1821, when his log tavern opened. So this early crop of residents of the Niagara Frontier, had to make the land sustainable and had to clear land to create settlements. The Crown was no longer claiming the lumber here, but the settlers were very dependent on the lumber market and trade, and instead of the British Navy being supplied, they supplied the United States Navy.

Once there was enough land that was cleared away, the large farms started popping up. The German settlers were among the earliest to perfect the agriculture in Pendleton. The first big settlements were again, near Tonawanda Creek, and it was Philip Woock from Bavaria, in 1832, and then other German families of Adam Koepfinger and Joseph Schimp. Orin Fisk, of who Fisk Road is named after, settled on the East side of the Canal in 1844, and his family had been settled in Royalton in around 1810. Some families were clearing 200 acres of farmland, while others were only clearing small amounts, but the Germans were among the first farmers, and they are given credit for most of the agricultural improvements in the area.



WATER/SEWER DEPARTMENT

If you have a fire hydrant nearby, it would be greatly appreciated if you could help to keep the snow cleared in case of an emergency to allow complete visibility and total accessibility. Whether you plow your driveway yourself or you have a contractor plow for you, please remind them **not** to push the snow toward or around the hydrants so that it does not become buried.

Local Law No. 1-2011 states: "It shall be unlawful for any person or company in any manner to obstruct the use or maintenance of any fire hydrant within the Town of Pendleton, or to place any material or utility of any type in front thereof or within 10 feet of either side thereof. Any person who violates any provision of this article shall be liable for a penalty of \$250.00 and a penalty of \$500.00 for each successive violation".

We have completed our fall fire hydrant maintenance program. We flush "operate" each hydrant in order to insure that it opens and closes freely and shuts down completely. We then lube the three caps to make sure they can be easily removed when necessary. We pump out all remaining water in the hydrant barrel to avoid freezing during the cold winter months.

Just a reminder, that if your water meter freezes, there will be a \$100 to \$200 meter fee charge for a replacement. In most cases heat tape or insulation wrap could help keep meter and pipes from freezing.

I would like to thank those of you who have responded to our phone calls and letters we sent out in regards to replacing your water meter readers. Out of 1560 for replacement, we have completed 960, so far. The older style reader is no longer compliant by the FCC regulations and the life expectancy of the older readers are reaching their limits. In most cases, it will only take approximately 10 minutes to replace and will not interrupt your water service. Also, there is no charge to replace the meter reader.

We will be calling you or sending a letter requesting to set up an appointment. Please feel free to give us a call at 716-625-8033. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.

All water/sewer payments should be mailed to:

Lockport, NY 14094

If you are selling your home please contact our office **5 business days** prior to closing to schedule a final read and a **mandatory water/sewer line inspection**.

There is a \$25.00 fee for the inspection.

You must have your water & sewer lines inspected before you close on your house!!!

If you are purchasing a new home please contact our office ASAP to set up an account.

If you are leaving the area temporarily (i.e. Vacation) please be advised that the post office will not forward water bills, even if you have a forwarding request at the post office.

To avoid late fees to your account you can pre-pay your bill (s), or have your bill sent to the temporary address. Please contact the billing clerk at 625-8833 ext. 11 to make these arrangements.

Please visit our website at www.pendletonny.us for more detailed water billing information. When you get to the homepage click on Town Departments at the top of the page, scroll down to Water/Sewer Department, then click on Information under “Water Billing Department.”

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

As we approach yet another winter, here are just a few friendly reminders regarding “**SNOW**”. Please do **not** place snow out in the roadways or shoulders when clearing your driveways. Anyone who hires a contractor must remind them to adhere to this request. Last year with the tremendous amount of snow accumulation, we actually had trouble plowing the new Bear Ridge Estates sub-division due to various contractors plowing and depositing snow from driveways into and across the road. By now, we should have our stakes in place to guide our plows around most of our roads. This is very helpful to our drivers during any snow event. Anyone having any concerns about the stakes please let us know. We could also add some additional stakes near your sprinklers to help prevent any harm. We are **NOT** responsible for any damage that occurs but will try to keep it to a minimum. Also please keep in mind that too many stakes will prevent us from clearing the roads.

Speaking of the Bear Ridge Estates, thanks to some neighbors and my crew, we found a couple of “**flaws**” in the drainage system. Part of the problem was that some growth near the inlet pipe to the east pond was preventing approximately one foot of water from entering. We removed it and cleared out the silt. Another major problem discovered was in the overall design. Water from outside the sub-division was actually entering into the drainage system. Once the problem was discovered, we corrected it immediately to its origin keeping the outside water in the back ditch which wraps around the perimeter of the sub-division. We still need to plant grass seed in some of the backyards along the east properties and a

little cleanup will be needed to be done on the new phase. Also, in the near future, we need to get control of the ditch on the south side. Along the wetlands we need to reduce the growth in and around the ditch to keep it flowing.

As far as the Ridgeview drainage, the engineer is looking at some areas to see if anything can be done in the future to relieve the flood waters.

I have some good news for Feigle Road Residents. Yeah!! The project will start and finish next year, 2016, minus anymore government interruptions. There, of course, will be some inconveniences including closing the road to one-way traffic at some point for a couple of weeks. The final result will be a safer, slightly wider road. Although it is a country road, we will help as much as possible when we can. Also, Fisk Road, which qualifies for the same Federal money, will be voted on sometime after March. I will do all I can to plead our case. Basically, all counties from across the region fight for a road in their area. All we can do is hope for the best.

This spring I will re-evaluate our road program and work with the board for a final plan.

Anyone with a request for special needs during this winter please do not hesitate to call. For an example, I have a couple of residents that need to get to a medical facility for treatment. In most cases we are able to assist you with this.

RECREATION NEWS

Come “burn off” those dreaded holiday calories and join us for an evening of fun in the water! The Pendleton Family Swim Program is “FREE” and is open to all Pendleton residents. Be sure to mark your calendars for the following Friday evenings from 7-9 PM in the Starpoint Pool; January 8, 15, 22, 29, February 5, 12 & 26. All children **MUST** be accompanied by an adult. If the school is closed due to weather or any other emergency, the swim program will also be cancelled for that evening.

It takes approximately five straight days of constant freezing temperatures to produce a safe surface on our ice rink. Signs will show when the rink is open. Hours of operation (when open) are 7 AM- 9 PM. In an effort to find a balance between hockey and free skating

Needless to say our association has been well received in town with our ranks growing almost four fold in just over 1 ½ years to almost 60 active members. Many thanks go out to the officers and board members for the time spent planning, organizing and attending all the functions and meetings necessary to make the association a success. We are committed to streamlining our presence, expanding our impact and assistance, delivering our messages while completing our mission.

We recently have received tax exempt status from the government and are now positioned to formally start accepting contributions and raising funds for our main mission of constructing a permanent memorial in our town. As most vets in town receiving property tax exemptions are aware, Kelli Coughlin (Town Assessor) has requested that they visit town hall and verify all your information on file. Kelli is also encouraging any vet NOT receiving the property tax exemption to please apply for this benefit, YOU HAVE EARNED IT. In either case, bring your DD 214 discharge papers and /or supporting docs when you visit town hall. If you do not have your DD 214 PLEASE verify your information regardless. Most vet association members have already verified their information; it only takes a few minutes and assures your exemption going forward while Kelli automates her office and files. Kelli would like to have all verifications

completed by 12/31/15 if possible. I hope every vet receiving the exemption has received the letter from Kelli because you may not receive the notice, now is the time to act. This newsletter is scheduled to be mailed the last week of December. Keep an eye open for a VETERANS ONLY bulletin board to be placed next to the memorial board inside town hall. It is under construction as we go to print. We will post the latest information for veteran's affairs and upcoming events of importance.

Last but not least, our first evening meeting 11/18/2015 was a great success. More evening meetings to come. Our regular agenda was followed. We welcomed 7 town resident veterans for their first meeting. We also welcomed Boy Scout, Wyatt Kneoppel, seeking our involvement in his community project towards Eagle Scout ranking. As always we were pleased with the turnout and delighted in the response to our never ending recruitment effort. REMINDER

If you move from your primary residence in Pendleton it is your obligation to notify the Assessor's office. Each residence that is receiving the Star Exemption signed the Star application acknowledging that they would notify the Assessor of their change in residency.

Please remember all exemptions are due by March 1st. If you will be turning 65 in 2016 you may be eligible for the Enhanced Star. If you believe you might be eligible please call the Assessor's office 625-8833 ext.16

The Assessors office is still asking anyone receiving the veteran's exemption to please come in to verify your information. We are finding veterans that are entitled to more exemptions than they have been receiving. If you are a veteran and are not receiving the Veterans Exemption please come see me in the office and bring your DD214 to see if you are eligible.

Also please go to www.tax.ny.gov or stop in the

office to get some pamphlets about the reassessment process. I feel it is necessary for our town to look into doing a Reassessment soon. If you reference the Arm's Length Sales that I post in each newsletter you can start to understand why I think its time for a Reassessment.
