FROM THE SUPERVISOR'S DESK

Over the summer months we experienced quite a wide range of weather and as the Pendleton Farm & Home Days approached, many became quite concerned as the hot and dry weather turned to rain. Fortunately, we experienced two great days and the rain that did fall didn't affect the event. It was a beautiful night on Saturday evening, the second day of the event, as the park was filled with people, the band played, and a great fireworks show filled the air. Speaking for all, I'd like to thank everyone who helped to make this year's second annual celebration a great success.

This summer also saw activity south of the Town Hall as the Pendleton Veteran's Association began work on the new monument dedicated to recognizing all Town residents who served in the military. The PVA's fundraising campaign is still going, as their goal has not yet been met, and the public's support of this project is greatly appreciated. To learn more about the PVA or to donate, please contact the Town Hall for information.

Moving from summer into fall, the big event for the Town Board is budget season. The budget process is certainly not as fun and exciting as the Farm & Home Days, but an important annual event for town government. Fortunately, sales tax revenues have increased after at least three years of decreases and this is great news as the board continues to be mindful of property taxes. Sales tax is the major source of revenue for the Town's general and highway funds and makes possible the services we all depend on. and I encourage all to attend a meeting or two to learn more about how your local government operates.

Related to the 2019 budget, there are two exciting additions of revenue that we have to report. Specifically, I'm writing about a little more than \$120,000 in grant funding secured for the town through the efforts

of Senator Robert Ortt and Assemblyman Ray Walter. This funding will help to continue with improvements in the Town Park, including the construction of a handicap accessible bathroom, continued pathway paving, and the addition of an exciting new piece of equipment in the all-inclusive playground area. It is great to see so many people visiting the park each day and over the coming years we will continue to invest in this great asset. Continued thanks go to Mason's Mission Foundation for the vision and efforts that made the all-inclusive playground a reality.

Personally, I don't anticipate too much other excitement during the budget process, but there are two items that many are watching closely. The first issue is the recent announcement of a potential commercial solar project proposed for the Towns of Pendleton and Cambria. The specific area of focus is property north and south of Lockport Road, near the intersection with Comstock Road. At the moment, the town has received no formal proposals for this project, but if you want to stay informed, watch the Town's website and also go to www.bearridgesolar.com.

The second item we're watching is the ongoing efforts of National Fuel to construct a compressor station on Killian Road with pipeline upgrades. As reported recently in the local news, litigation related to permits for the entire Northern Access Project continues between the New York State Department of Environmental Conversation and National Fuel. Our Town Attorney and consulting attorney continue to monitor the situation and take action as needed to protect the Town's interest.


As outlined in the past Town newsletter, the Town Board has taken action on concerns related to speeding and roadway safety. Working with the Niagara County Sheriff's Office (NCSO), additional patrols focused solely on speeders started in May and will continue until at least the beginning of October. As we evaluate the outcome, I will subjectively say that the added patrols have had a positive effect. As we craft the 2019 budget, the Town Board will include funding to continue these patrols.

In addition to speeding and roadway safety concerns, the Town Board continues to hear various other concerns related to other safety issues. To

WENDELVILLE FIRE COMPANY NEWS

As the seasons change we begin to close the windows and begrudgingly turn on our furnaces. Each season has it's own set of situations to be dealt with, and this season is no different. One of the things we need to address is the presence of Carbon Monoxide in our homes and buildings. Yes, most of us are aware of this possibility and some of us even have Carbon Monoxide detectors in our home.... But, do we understand what it is, why this is a threat to our health, and what to do if that monitor goes off? Here is a very brief explanation, hoping that it will be of help to you.

What is Carbon Monoxide? Carbon monoxide, or "CO," is an odorless, colorless gas that can kill you.

Where is CO found? CO is found in fumes produced any time you burn fuel in cars or trucks, small engines, stoves, lanterns, grills, fireplaces, gas ranges, or furnaces. CO can build up indoors and poison people and animals that breathe it.

What are the symptoms of CO poisoning? The most common symptoms of CO poisoning are headache, dizziness, weakness, upset stomach, vomiting, chest pain, and confusion. CO symptoms are often described as "flu-like." If you breathe in a lot of CO it can make you pass out or kill you. People who are sleeping or drunk can die from CO poisoning before they have symptoms.

Who is at risk from CO poisoning? Everyone is at risk for CO poisoning. Infants, the elderly, people with chronic heart disease, anemia, or breathing problems are more likely to get sick from CO. Each year, more than 400 Americans die from unintentional CO poisoning not linked to fires, more than 20,000 visit the emergency room, and more than 4,000 are hospitalized.

How can I prevent CO poisoning in my home? Install a battery-operated or battery back-up CO detector in your home and check or replace the battery when you change the time on your clocks each spring and fall. Place your detector where it will wake you up if it alarms, such as outside your bedroom. Consider buying a detector with a digital readout.

This detector can tell you the highest level of CO concentration in your home in addition to alarming. Replace your CO detector every five years.

What do I do if the Carbon Monoxide detector goes off in my home?

Better safe than sorry! If you are unsure, call 911 and speak to the dispatcher. They will ask if there are symptoms of CO poisoning and may be able to help you by telling you how to proceed. If the reading on the detector is high, they will instruct you to leave the home and they will send Wendelville personnel out to check. We will bring our more sensitive equipment out and see what's going on and why your monitor is alarming. Many times, it may be an old or defective monitoring unit.

This is the beginning of Fire Prevention Season and October is Fire Prevention month! You may see our special Unit at Starpoint Schools or some of the other schools and churches in the area. We have a specialized program for all age groups, pre-k through seniors, so if you would like us to come to your facility for a demonstration, please call Assistant Chief Randy Moje (716-913-3346) and he can help make the arrangements.

FROM THE WATER/SEWER BILLING DEPARTMENT

First things first, I want to give a huge shout out to all who helped put together our 2nd annual Pendleton Farm and Home Days! The amount of work that goes into this event is never ending, and being fortunate enough to watch the set-up from start to finish is just amazing! Thankfully the weather did cooperate, for the most part, and both days were a huge success, with an amazing fireworks display to end the event. Great job everyone!

Well, here it is the last week of August and it looks like summer is going to be hanging around for a while longer. Boy what a hot, dry summer it has been, I sure hope we are going to have a nice fall this year. It seems like over the past few years we have gone from summer to winter with no easing into the frigid temperatures.

I am expecting October water bills to be relatively high this year as we have had very little rain this season (the consumption period for your October water bill reflects water used in July, August & September). Remember that when you compare your water consumptions you must compare billing period to billing period (ex. Oct., 2015 with Oct., 2016; Oct., 2016 with Oct., 2017 and so forth) not previous bill to current bill.

Well, I've been very busy setting up all of the new builds in our town and updating accounts for the Pendleton Lion's Club Directory. We are missing an awful lot of telephone numbers for the residents in town so if you have the time, please go through the Pendleton Directory to see if your telephone number is listed, and is correct. If not, please call me at (716) 625-8833 ext. 111 to update your account.

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT THE TOWN OF PENDLETON DOES NOT MAKE ADJUSTMENTS FOR SPRINKLER SYSTEMS OR THE FILLING OF SWIMMING POOLS.

- * Billing cycles occur in January, April, July and October.
- * Water bills are mailed out by the last Friday of the billing month.
- * If you do not receive a bill by the end of the first week of the following month please contact the billing department at 625-8833, ext. 111.
- * For your convenience there is a lockbox located in the foyer at the back entrance to the Town Hall.
- * Payments placed in the lockbox will be credited to your account on the <u>next business day.</u>
- * If you pay online please allow 10 business days for mailing.

If you are selling your home please contact the Water & Sewer Department at 625-8033, as soon as possible to schedule a mandatory water/sewer line inspection. **YOU MUST HAVE YOUR WATER** & SEWER LINES INSPECTED BEFORE YOU CLOSE ON YOUR HOUSE!!! There is a \$50.00 fee for the inspection. If any repairs need to be made, there may be additional fees involved. If you are purchasing a new home please contact our office ASAP to set up an account.

IF YOU ARE LEAVING THE AREA TEMPORARILY (i.e. Vacation) PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT THE POST OFFICE WILL NOT FORWARD WATER BILLS, EVEN IF YOU HAVE A FORWARDING REQUEST AT THE POST OFFICE.

To avoid late fees to your account you can pre-pay your bill (s), or have your bill sent to the temporary address. Please contact the billing clerk at 625-8833 ext. 111 to make these arrangements.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Hello, It's been another interesting summer, weather wise especially near-drought early and then lots of rain in August.

By now we will have completed our major job of milling and paving Ridgeview sub division. This was a great shared services job as Niagara County and crew did the milling with their new mill machine. Town of Lockport paved Lakeview Ct. our other neighboring towns brought their paver and crew with roller to pave the rest. Along with my staff, some of the other towns that helped with trucking were: Wheatfield, Cambria, Newfane and Porter. Newfane also sent a guy and their skid steer mill to help crew clean up some areas the large mill couldn't get. Town of Wheatfield sent a crew to "Tack Coat" before we applied the Blacktop.

We have also been going around our Town roads with our "Hot Box" that we share with the Town of Newfane. This is a trailer type box that keeps the Blacktop hot and gives our guys time to apply it without wasting any. We have gone around the majority of our roads fixing any bad spots.

Speaking of Bad Spots: We are still on pace to have Fisk Road fixed next summer. Again, this is being done with \$2.8 million grant. Engineering eats up a sizable portion of the dollars but the road will be re-surfaced, shoulder widened and road side drainage installed. Look for more info as it gets closer to the date of starting.

A reminder: for approximately 8 years we have not chipped brush during the summer months between July 4th and Labor Day. We cannot afford to tie up 2 men as this is the time where all the Towns in Niagara County do most of our road repair work. Without putting a schedule on it we will after Labor Day try to get through the Town every 2 weeks. This is one of the services that had to be cut as the board had cut out manpower from 8 to 5 men. The new board has started to increase our manpower and we are up to 7 including a mechanic. As the Town has grown more with different needs we are trying to adjust.

It does literally take us from the time grass needs cutting till the 4th of July celebration to get the parks, cemeteries and buildings and grounds prepped. My guys also do a great job helping many volunteers prep before and clean after the Farm and Homes Days. Which I think is worth the effort. Thanks a lot to Denuelle and Joanne for starting the event

This Fall we will be mowing brush and weeds on as many of our off-road drainage ditches as time and mother nature allows. We will be moving roadside ditches for a second time as well. We try to do this as late as possible so our ditches drain well during the winter snow melt and spring rains.

If there are any dollars left over from Ridgeview I will try to Crack Seal some of our roads and all of our roads will get a fresh coat of paint on the lines.

As time flies along we will be prepping for winter around November. At some point we will be installing stakes mostly in sub divisions to guide our drivers plowing snow from the roadways. Although we will do some minor lawn damage we are not responsible for anything in the right of way including lawn sprinklers and landscaping.

I will continue reaching out to those of you that called about piping and drainage issues. We are years behind and will continue to try to play "catch up" from previous cuts

In closing I want to thank the Wendelville Fire Co. personnel. Those of you who don't know I had a battle with kidney stones earlier this summer and really needed their help as Kathy called 911 when I couldn't get off the living room floor in pain. They were there to help in a matter of a couple of minutes. Sometimes they are underappreciated but boy, do I thank them for helping me.

Please remember all exemptions are due by March 1st. If you will be turning 65 in 2019 you may be eligible for the Enhanced Star. If you believe you might be eligible please call the Assessor's office 625-8833 ext. 116.

TOWN HISTORIAN



As this issue reaches you, Starpoint has begun, so let's reflect on the town history of schoolhouses as we launch into this new academic year for our local children. Pendleton began its educational roots in the early 1800's with 8 districts. **School #1** was located on

Congress which is now East Canal, and Wendelville Fire

Station #3 was refurbished from this building in 1971. School #2, was located on Tonawanda Creek near Bear Ridge. School #3 was located on Bear Ridge east of Campbell and Meyer and the building still stands. The annual budget for 1942-43 was \$1,725, and the teacher made an annual salary of \$857. School #4 was located on Mapleton at the corner of Aiken near Starpoint, known as Mapleton School, and was a "melting pot" of nationalities. A common lunch was baked potatoes cooked in the coal stove and fresh veggies made into stew. How does this



compare to our school lunches now??!! The stove also kept the classroom warm, and it was the responsibility of an older boy to start it on Sunday afternoon to prepare it for the week, and bigger boys hauled coal in from the shed. Our children do not understand what they had to do just to satisfy basic needs, however they still engaged in valuable learning and playtime. School #5 was located on Beach Ridge just west of Townline and had pupils from Pendleton and Wheatfield. School #6 was located on Bear Ridge between Feigle and Hodgeville (Mapleton), across from the Erie Canal. One





article in 1942 mentioned a mother's club, and it functioned very much like our PTA does now. There was a highly effective reading center and students listened to morning news on the radio. The classroom was a center for "democratic living" because students not only came to school together but lived, worked, and played together. The one room school was "a living example of learning". The teacher stated "You don't need tape recorders and televisions...just children and books, plus a little interest...modern schools

lose sight of the children's needs because of all the marvelous equipment they have on hand..." <u>School #7</u> was located on Beach Ridge west of Campbell behind Kandyland but was moved. A gentleman (Gary Pashong) recently

presented me with pictures of his mother and aunts who were in the 1920 class. Gertrude, Violet, and Leona Heisterburg lived on a farm nearby and attended here. School #8 was located on Tonawanda Creek east of Campbell across from the current Wendelville Fire Station. Our previous town historian, Ben Sobczyk (now deceased), attended this schoolhouse in the 1930's.






Good Shepherd was a Catholic Elementary School located where the Parish is on Tonawanda Creek but closed a few years ago. Starpoint became centralized in 1953 which allowed for state financial aid and educational improvements as well as residency requirements. In 1954, a contest was held to name it and Sally Loftus, a first grader at School #1, was the winner!! She creatively chose "Starpoint" because the 5 points symbolize the 5 communities served, and she was awarded \$100. She moved away and did not finish at Starpoint, however, she later

returned to teach third grade as Mrs. Heim and her daughters attended. The construction of schoolhouses in Pendleton was an "... expression of the community's love for their children" (a quote from a board member). There were about 900 students covering 100 sq. miles and the first budget was \$267,240. In September 1954, residents voted on the school's location, a 70 acre parcel on Mapleton was purchased for \$14,000, and Starpoint began....Good Luck to all our students this upcoming year!! If anyone has further information about the schools, or any other town history topic, please contact me anytime. Also, you are welcome to visit our Historical Society for more information/pictures.

An evening meeting will be scheduled and the date will be on the town website and posted on the electronic billboard in front of Town Hall.

All high school graduates with no plans at this time might think of enlisting in the armed forces as a stepping stone to adult life. A four year enlistment comes with a big tuition assistance program after discharge.

A new feature of our newsletter will start with this issue. I will be doing a short Biography of one of our Members military duty. It will be under the paragraph heading "Did you know".

<u>Did you Know</u> - Judy Izard, licensed pharmacist and owner of Pendleton Star Pharmacy at Pendleton Center is a Decorated Veteran! Judy served over 20 years in the New York Army National Guard. Retired in 2013 as a Major with one deployment to Afghanistan and served as a Medical Logistics Officer. Stop by and support Judy and thank her for her service!

In closing, remember US Flags are always available for purchase from the PVA (Gordie 534-2724) and also available from Judy at Pendleton Star Pharmacy. All flags are made in the USA. We carry all standard sized flags and special flags can be ordered.

There is a bin for proper flag retirement (disposal) located on the front porch of the Pendleton Historical Society log cabin.
