FROM THE SUPERVISOR'S DESK

This year has gone by quickly at the Town Hall, as many things are happening. At times I wonder if I'm imagining things, but others share that they too are seeing each month become busier than the last. So you have fair warning, this article will be long because so much is in the works. In a small town like ours, little things mean a lot and I try to keep everyone as informed as possible.

First, I'd like to thank John Lavrich and Jim Argo for their years of dedicated service to the Town of Pendleton. Both are retiring from their respective positions at the end of the year after lengthy service to the Town of Pendleton. John leaves a void on the Planning Board that will be hard to fill and Jim's dedication to the Water & Sewer Department has been greatly appreciated. Thank you both for your service to the Town of Pendleton and we all wish you both the best in your retirement.

At the end of November we welcomed our new building inspector, Jason Thompson, who previously worked as Deputy Building Inspector in the Town of Lockport. A lot of effort was dedicated in the Building Department over the past two years to ensure that we are up to date in all areas and to provide the best customer service possible. With his experience and training to draw upon, Jason will continue the important work required with building inspection and code enforcement. Also joining the team is part-time clerk Kim Frey who will be assisting in keeping the Building Department working efficiently with the best customer service possible.

Before I delve into the tedious descriptions of the Board's recent budget session, I'd like to thank all Town employees, volunteers, elected officials, and

board and committee members for their hard work and dedication during 2018. I see great cooperation and collaboration, on a daily basis, as all work together to keep our growing town moving in the right direction. Thank you all! This past November, the Town Board adopted a budget for 2019 and the process was as difficult as always. We work to balance the needs

in all areas of town government with the reality of

in all areas of town government with the reality of limited revenue. Unfortunately, as I've outlined numerous times before, we rely heavily on sales tax revenue to balance the Town's budget and this revenue has declined and been stagnant for multiple years. Fortunately, we are seeing an upturn and we're cautiously optimistic that this will continue through at least 2019.

For 2019, we are anticipating relying in part on the Town's savings to balance the budget for two reasons. First, we took a conservative approach to estimating sales tax revenue, as we'd rather be surprised by a good return, as opposed to being disappointed that we were too optimistic. Secondly, we budgeted to address multiple important needs that we have in town government that cannot be delayed any longer. If we wait, the cost always goes up as does the potential for problems and increased liability.

At the Town Hall, we are investing in a complete network server upgrade that is well overdue. Recently the Town approved an agreement with Niagara County to have the County's Information Technology Department take over responsibility for all aspects of computer network security and maintenance. As we become increasingly reliant on our computer systems for every area of government, the security and reliability also becomes paramount. With the County's help, the Town will continually stay ahead of security risks and have the ability to draw on the extensive training and experience the County's IT employees possess.

In addition to the network upgrades, the Town Hall is updating the antiquated software system used for all-aspects of accounting. This software upgrade compliments work started a year ago, with the installation of a new software system in the Building Department. The new software is a bit of an investment, but certainly necessary and we plan to continue software upgrades in other departments in the near future.

Another area of investment is in public works, as this is the largest component of the Town's budget. Updates in the Highway Garage continue with funds budgeted for extensive HVAC repairs and new windows and doors. This work was budgeted for 2018, but was put on hold for another project that became necessary in the Highway Garage, including demolition and rebuilding of a large floor drain. The Highway Garage is aging and we're working to keep ahead of repairs.

In addition to the Highway Garage work, money is budgeted for a new tandem axle truck with plow to add to the Town's aging fleet. The estimated cost is in excess of \$220,000, but very necessary. Some may have noticed a plow truck driving around town last year from the Town of Newfane. This was due to the fact that a Pendleton truck was out of service for an extended period of time for repairs. I've also received calls from our Highway Superintendent late at night and early on weekend mornings, warning me that multiple trucks are out of service from snow plowing due to break-downs. We cannot have this and the only responsible action is to keep moving forward with an appropriate equipment replacement plan.

The 2019 budget also reflects a continued aggressive road maintenance plan, as I'm always told that all highway superintendents learn to "keep the good roads good". An unfortunate example of what happens when sufficient resources are not dedicated to road maintenance is Fisk Road. The final design for the Fisk Road reconstruction is almost done and we're on track for work in 2019. The down side to this is that the estimated cost could be as high as \$3.4 million. The up side is we have \$2.8 million in Federal funding for the project. Bottom line, the Highway Department has worked hard in the past two years to move ahead with paving and maintenance and it's not in the Town's best interest to slow down now.

Personnel costs also continue to be a substantial cost of town government, which is typically true for any organization. On the positive side, the Town is working with its insurance broker to address health insurance costs, which will reduce the projected increase from 16.08% to 2.96%. Additionally, the Town has been working with its insurance broker in many other ways to ensure proper protection while decreasing liability. An example of this is the adoption of a new facilities usage agreement at the urging of the Town's insurance broker. The

IMPORTANT: If you pay your bills through your bank's online bill paying program you will need to allow enough time for your check to be mailed to and received at our office. The envelopes sent by your bank DO NOT have a US POSTMARK that is stamped by the Post Office therefore it will be considered received the day it is actually received in the office. The payment MUST BE received in the office by the due date in order to consider it a timely payment. (Real Property Tax Law §925.) Town Board continues to look for ways to limit costs while maintaining good customer service to Town residents.

Other items included in the 2019 budget include increased investment in the Town Park, a large drainage project near Tonawanda Creek Road, continued funds for litigation necessary to protect the Town, a new mandate for firefighter cancer insurance, continued focused speed enforcement, and increased cost of fuel and salt. The final budget reflects a tax levy increase that is under the New York State tax cap and the Town Board is confident that a good balance was reached in prioritizing requests. In the big picture, Town of Pendleton property owners have one of the lowest <u>town</u> property tax rates in Niagara County.

In more interesting news, we currently have two new architectural proposals focused on possible court additions and replacement of the historical society building with a new structure for all Town groups to use. Though it seems like both projects have gone around in circles for the past couple of years, with the Fisk Road project coming close to completion, the Town is in a better position to make plans that can be acted upon. Receiving \$2.8 million is great, but this involves a reimbursement process, meaning you have to expend the money before submitting for reimbursement. This process ties-up Town resources and we can't have too many things going at once. Hopefully, we'll finally be able to move forward on one or both of these projects in 2019 and 2020.

In closing, I hope all have a great winter and hopefully we won't have to wait too long for spring weather. Please remember that Town Board meetings are open to the public and I encourage all to attend an occasional meeting to learn about all that is happening in town. Also, Town Board meeting minutes and a lot more is available on the Town's website, so navigate there often for the latest news and information.

There is a \$50.00 fee for the inspection which will be added to your water/sewer bill. When you receive your actual closing date, please contact the billing clerk at 625-8833, ext. 111 to schedule a final reading.

You must have your water & sewer lines inspected before you close on your house!!!

If you are purchasing a new home please contact our office ASAP to set up an account.

If you are leaving the area temporarily (i.e. Vacation) please be advised that <u>the post office will not forward water</u> <u>bills</u>, even if you have a forwarding request at the post office. Please consider prepaying your bill.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Hello, Let's start with an update on Fisk Road. We are on schedule for 2019 Summer construction. We officially are receiving \$2.8 million grant. In order to receive grant money it requires certain criteria including lots of engineering and strict right of way regulations. With the design engineers plan out, total cost of the project will end up near \$3.5 million. As far as the project itself, it will be a little similar to the Fiegle Road project a few years back. Our grant for Fisk has strict ROW "right of way" regulations meaning all of the grant work has to stay within the ROW. Some of the ditches are off the ROW so therefore the contractor that gets the bid (which will go out the Spring 2019) has to stay within the ROW which on Fisk is a total of 49 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet. As the majority of the job will be contracted out, we will be overseeing and doing some work outside of the ROW. Expect some delays during the construction process. We intend to close the road to local traffic only. There will be signs posted all around the area to direct vehicles. More on this project as time goes on.

We hit the snow season with a bang. A lot of break downs on the first 2 snows in early November. Our mechanic Mike did an outstanding job repairing break downs on the fly. I'd send 3 trucks out 1 come back, 2 more out 1 back etc. Our large tandem trucks are aging fast and 2019 we will start replacing them with new ones one at a time ASAP. Approximant price for large tandem with plow and salter runs about \$225,000.00 so look for one new one fall 2019 as they literally take about 1 year to build. Thank the board for listening to the Highway needs as its tough for me during "tricky" weather to get a fleet of trucks out while they break down a lot. Like all of you we want to get into our vehicles and get the job done, fast without constant break downs.

By now we are into full winter mode and have all of our stakes installed to "guide" our trucks to the best of our ability. As a reminder: we are not responsible for anything in The Right of Way. Please do not place anything heavy or <u>permanent</u> in the ROW for safety reasons. The responsibly lies with you if someone is injured. We do repair any of our lawn damage either rolling the sod back over during thaws and in the Spring, minor topsoil and seed. Lawn sprinklers etc. you're on your own. Although some of you disagree, we need room to remove snow from the roadside and shoulder areas and need plenty of room to do so. Occasionally our plows do minor damage in plowing snow. Our stakes help as long as it doesn't <u>prevent</u> us from moving snow off the roads.

Ditching: we only were able to brush hog approximately half of our off road ditches and roadside ditches due to the heavy rains late summer and fall. If weather cooperates we'll try to get out during the winter to get some more done.

We have tried to play "catch up" with some of your roadside piping needs but are still years away. We will continue to try based on priorities around Town.

We will also try to get as many ditches cleaned as we

can as the Town Board continues to try to increase our manpower. We are almost always looking for at least part time seasonal help. Anyone looking for work should stop and see us at the Highway garage 664 Campbell Blvd. and apply. Must be 18 years old, valid driver's license and pass a drug and alcohol test.

We've also continued to help Masons Mission playground at the Park. If anyone hasn't visited yet please try to do so and see what a wonderful experience the ALL INCLUSIVE playground has to offer. There has been some added equipment late this fall and we will all try to continue the great growth at the park.

We've also done a little bit of work with the Pendleton Veterans as they are building a new monument by the exit at the Town Hall.

We will continue our brush chipping as weather permits. We try to get out every 2 weeks to "sweep" the Town. REMINDER: place brush properly at the shoulder so we can grab it and put through the chipper. We will NOT pick up "Bonfire" piles. VERY IMPORTANT note: we do NOT chip brush from July 4th through Labor Day. Please make note of this, as we need those months to get our road work and help our neighboring Towns do theirs as all Niagara County works together. Those of you in Pendale and Ridgeview got to see this cooperation the last couple of years during the milling and paving process. (Thanks again for all of your cooperation during the process). As Spring rolls along we'll evaluate all of our Town roads and make a final list that need attention. As of Fall I am watching the cracking on Meyer, Oakwood and Dunnigan. I definitely plan on surface treatments on Mapleton (between Campbell and Bear Ridge) also looking at Aiken definitely between Mapleton and Lockport Road.

Anyone with special needs of any kind...be it seniors, veterans, physical needs please do not hesitate to call. We will do the best we can to help you.

REMINDER: If you move from your primary residence in Pendleton it is your obligation to notify the Assessor's office. Each residence that is receiving the Star Exemption signed the Star application acknowledging that they would notify the Assessor of their change in residency.

Please remember all exemptions are due by March 1st. If you will be turning 65 in 2019 you may be eligible for the Enhanced Star. If you believe you might be eligible please call the Assessor's office 625-8833 ext. 116.






TOWN HISTORIAN NEWS

Pendleton...where did it get its name from??!! Well, we were graced with the presence of our town's namesake several weeks ago, and he is a wealth of knowledge and understanding about how our community began so long ago. At the end of August, I received a phone from a gentleman named Sylvester Pendleton Clarke, and he was looking for the town historian. One would think that he was my long lost brother as I reacted with such excitement and immediately went into action spreading the word and organizing a reception for our honored guest. You see, he is the great-grandson of the founder, Sylvester Pendleton Clarke. What a joy to welcome him!! Pendleton Center, originally a 132 acre parcel founded in 1827, was named after the village at the junction of Tonawanda Creek Road and the Erie Canal, where Mr. Clarke opened a tavern in 1821, then Pendleton Inn in 1822, and he later served as postmaster in 1823. This is the current location of Uncle G's and Wendelville fire station #3. Sylvester Pendleton Clarke was born in August 1870 in Rhode Island, and he spent his life as a surveyor, preacher, postmaster, innkeeper, and then settler. He was governor of Grand Island, underwent negotiations with the Native Americans, which earned him the rights to develop, survey, and govern this area. The completion of the Erie Canal and its junction created the nucleus of this town.

Willet Clark and Sarah Pendleton Clark had several children in Rhode Island in the early 1800's. The name "Pendleton" comes from her father, Captain Sylvester Pendleton, and they had a son Sylvester Pendleton Clarke in 1818. He married Shirza Penny and they had 4 children together; she died in 1811. He then married Lucy Wakefield and at age 58 he had his 13th child, Henry Clay in 1838; they had 15 children total together in Rhode Island. Henry married Sarah Jane Burgess from England, they had 9 children, and



Henry was 56 when they had their last child, Houghton W. Clarke, born in Buffalo in 1894. He (nickname Hotch) married Linda and settled to raise his family in Atlanta, GA, and their youngest son is Sylvester Pendleton Clarke, our beloved visitor on September 14th.

Hotch stated about our founder: "Many a man's accomplishments, objectives, and ideals die with him. But, not this pioneer in the early days

of helping to settle and plan the sound future of the western "Empire State", and the vast lands still awaiting development west of her, bordering on the Great Lakes...To this day, historians, writers, and his ancestry correspond in an effort to capture and record



his triumphs, trials, and rare character."

2001 was the last time our founder's great grandson came to visit, so this was an extraordinary honor and privilege to host him and his guests and be educated by him. Penn, as he is fondly called, has led an equally adventurous and successful life as his great-grandfather. He was also an entrepreneur, real estate broker in Georgia, land purchaser, settler, and investor, highly successful businessman, and world traveler (mostly by sailboat) with his wife Sharron. He has no children. The day was incredible, as it started with a reception here where Mr. Clarke shared with town employees and residents, many pictures were taken and gifts given to him, then he and his guests were escorted by our town clerk Deb Maurer and historical society director Carol Moeller to Starpoint where he presented to some young children, and from there they had lunch at Ship-n-Shore, visited his great-grandfather's historical gravesite on Monroe Street, and were treated to free ice cream by Uncle G's owner Rachel Lindamann, all before their trek to see Niagara Falls. What a fantastically memorable day for all !! Thank you to everyone who made the visit possible and memorable, and we hope he will return to see us again. 
