Historical Society Presentation

Carol Moeller of the Pendleton Historical Society appeared before the Board to present information about the condition of the Historical Society's Log Cabin. The history of the agreement between the Town and the Historical Society was presented. Mrs. Moeller also explained that CRA Engineering visited the location in May of 2015 and provided the Town Board with several recommendations. She reported that the building is deteriorating and is unsafe. The Historical Society has tried numerous times to contact the Town's grant writer and has not received a response. Mrs. Moeller, on behalf of the Historical Society, is asking the Board to make a motion to allow the grant writer to work with them to find a solution for this problem.

Mr. Joe Kania also presented on behalf of the Pendleton Historical Society. He stated that they will be holding a fundraiser for the Historical Society and that Melissa DiLapo, the owner of the Castles of Pendleton, has offered to have it at her property. Mr. Kania asked permission to hold this event at this location and asked the Town Board to provide a Certificate of Insurance for this event because the Town holds the insurance for the Historical Society. A discussion occurred regarding this request. Councilman Graham replied that he would contact the Town's insurance broker before they make a decision.

He cited RESOLUTION 161-19 [Resolution Confirming that the Bear Ridge Solar Project Violates the Town of Pendleton Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Law] that states the opposite.
