

Full Environmental Assessment Form

Part 3 provides the reasons in support of the determination of significance. The lead agency must complete Part 3 for every question in Part 2 where the impact has been identified as potentially moderate to large or where there is a need to explain why a particular element of the proposed action will not, or may, result in a significant adverse environmental impact.

Impact on Land - Construction of the wireless tower will involve minor impact to the land where water table is indicated as 0.67 feet. Tower foundations will be designed by licensed structural engineer.

Impact on Flooding - The entire parcel on which the project is located is within the 100-year floodplain, but outside of 500-year and floodway. The project will not impede, redirect or impact flood waters in any way.

Impact on Agricultural Resources - Web Soil Survey indicates that soils at the site are productive. However, the site is not part of an agricultural district, the site is owned by fire company with no intention to use for agricultural, and the construction of a wireless tower does not eliminate the ability to use remaining property for such use in the future.

Impact on Aesthetic Resources - The wireless tower will be visible to the surrounding area. The Planning Board has requested visual simulations from the applicant and will review the impact.

Impact on Historic and Archaeological Resources - Project is located near the Balgemann House (an eligible historic building), but no exact distance from the project was provided. In addition, the applicant did not provide any correspondence from the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (SHPO) with their determination. The Town may choose to request this concurrence. However, the project will not impact or change the structure or its eligibility in any way.
