

Trolley Trail, a regional greenway trail

About the Trolley Trail:

Pendleton, New York

Amenities: Walking Trail, Restrooms, Parking, Natural landscapes

This trail is a community treasure waiting for you to explore on foot or on your bike! It's a multi-use paved and gravel trail.

The Trolley Trail is named for the old International Railroad Company electric interurban train right-of-way that runs between the City of Lockport through the Towns of Lockport, Pendleton, Wheatfield and ending in the City of N. Tonawanda at River Rd, This trail will have a direct connection with the new Erie Canal Trail at Stevens St. canal bridge in City of Lockport to the new River Rd. Greenway Trail in N. Tonawanda. This trail would be developed into a regional multi-use trail designed to protect nature and provide wellness opportunities for both residents and guests.

The Trolley Trail has been flagged by the Greater Buffalo Niagara Regional Transportation Council in the region's long-term master plans since the early 1970s. Over the years, community groups and residents have rallied to bring it to life.

The Trolley Trail connects neighborhoods, schools, parks, retirement communities and business districts between City of Lockport, the Erie Canal Trails, Pendleton Center

Parks and Trails, and N. Tonawanda Niagara River Greenway Trail and completes a missing link in County's regional trail system. This bike and pedestrian trail follows the historic streetcar right-of-way that ran in the area from 1893 until late 1940's.

The idea of developing a trail within this historic right-of-way has been a dream in the community for decades. The trail now connects with existing Erie Canal Bike Trail in Lockport to complete an essential link in County's regional trails system.
