FROM THE SUPERVISOR'S DESK

As we roll into the summer, we all have shifted to a "new normal" as our country's response to the pandemic has continued since March. At this point there isn't much to say, other than I hope all are doing well, staying healthy and safe. The continuously changing orders, regulations, and guidance from the state and federal level have presented challenges to all involved in government, as well as in everyone's personal lives.

Since March the Town has posted updates to operational plans on the Town's website, Facebook page, and the Nextdoor.com site. As of the beginning of June, all Town of Pendleton facilities are closed to the public and anyone needing assistance may contact the Town by phone, email, and USPS mail. Also, there is a dropbox at the Town Hall for anyone who needs to drop-off paperwork to a Town office. All Town offices are operating and responding to all requests in a timely manner. Once we reach the point where it is operationally safe to once again open offices to the public, we will.

The challenges of the pandemic and the resulting negative economic impact on the Town have necessitated various cancellations. The Town's annual July 4th fireworks display has been cancelled due to the uncertainty of large gatherings of people and also the cost. Also, the annual summer recreation program has been cancelled due to similar concerns. We are all optimistic and hopeful that we will be able to have such events in 2021.

During the past few months the Town has worked to remain in compliance with regulations related to the COVID-19 pandemic and this resulted in the closing of Town parks, playgrounds, basketball courts, tennis courts, and the roller hockey area. Signage and barricades have been placed as appropriate and we ask that people continue to respect these closures. Once we are legally allowed to open these recreational areas, we will. Keep in mind that local law enforcement remains updated by the Town and patrol will enforce the rules.

As many people have found themselves at home with extra time, the usage of local trails has

increased significantly. The new trail along the canal operated by the NYS Canal Corp. has been very busy and it's great that it was completed and open prior to this spring. The Town's trail system has also seen a lot of use and also brought to light a few issues. In May the Town Board temporarily closed the trail to motor vehicles (e.g. ATVs) and directed the Highway Department to begin work to address wear and tear from years of use. We also are working on putting together a group of volunteers to help shape the future of our trail system as there is still much work to do. Stay posted for updates as the Town continues to address its trail assets.

The need to eliminate gatherings of people has also necessitated the cancellation of Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals meetings and public hearings. Chairmen and members of these boards are anxious to get back to work and as soon as they are cleared to do so. they will. We apologize for any inconvenience this has created for the public, but the open sharing of information with the public and public feedback is essential for the items brought to these boards for consideration. Thank you for your patience.

During this time some areas of government have slowed down a bit, but within the Building and Code Enforcement office, life has been quite busy. The folks working in this office are dedicated and do a great job. Please be patient as a busy town like Pendleton provides a constant stream of work in the areas of building permits, inspection, and code enforcement. Also know that they have the backing of the Town Board to consistently and uniformly enforce the Town of Pendleton Town Code, irrespective of

who or what is involved.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

COVID-19. This is certainly a time we will never forget. We were ALL affected by the coronavirus one way or another. My thoughts and prayers go out to any of you that lost a loved one due to this terrible virus. Many things change and shape our lives; this is one that nobody saw coming or wanted. I've seen some amazing people adapt their lives and come through this unscathed and I've seen some people that did not. Short term future is totally changed and long term is still unknown. I'm hoping for some sort of normalcy with some minor changes but time will tell.

As for the Public Works Department, we did cut the crew into half shifts for approximately 1 month to try to be as safe as possible. As of now we are back to full operation with as many precautions as possible and are adapting the best we can.

This is as I always say, "When it's time to mow grass everything we do is ready for us." This includes building & grounds maintenance, changing equipment from winter to summer, road work, drainage, and anything else we can get our equipment and manpower to.

Our road budget at this time has been cut from \$250,000 to \$100,000 therefore nothing major can be planned. I will try to do some minor patching of the roads that are in need and wait to see if anything changes with the funding.

We are also adjusting to some manpower issues but I always adjust to that.

We will hopefully try to get to some of the drainage problem areas. As most of you know Pendleton is a very flat town and it's hard to keep up with storms of 2" or more of rain.

One of the other tasks this year is to do some work on the 4-wheeler/ATV path. If you haven't heard, the Town Board has it closed to ATV's until we evaluate and do some grading. Since many of you have had to stay home from work the blacktop path has gotten a lot more use. We will also use our tractor with a broom on the back to get the blacktop swept and clear as much as possible.

We "own" the trail from Townline Road to Lockport Road that crosses Killian, Meyer, Campbell, Feigle, and Mapleton. The State "owns" the one that runs from Robinson to Tonawanda Creek along the Erie Canal.

The goal is to have the 4-wheeler/ATV path back open by July if possible. If and when it opens, anyone using it must obey the rules which include staying off the blacktop but most importantly respect anyone walking/ biking on the blacktop path.

Keep in mind, we <u>do not chip brush from July</u> <u>4th to Labor Day</u>. We will try to get through the town every 2 weeks otherwise. As a reminder, please place brush on the shoulder of the road with the butt ends facing the road and spread out instead of large stacked piles. Also, we will not chip brush that tree companies place out to the road. The purpose to our chipping is general yard clean up and is not intended for lot clearing or contractors' trees.

We also mow our roadside ditches twice a year, in the spring and in the fall. Our off road drainage ditches get mowed late summer into the fall.

As of this writing, the playgrounds remain closed and other activities like tennis are partially open using the new "social distancing" guidelines as well as wearing masks when not able to maintain a safe distance. We will adjust with regulations as time goes on.

Well, it looks like winter is finally over! Sure took long enough. Was hoping we could have a nice spring before the hot weather settled in but it looks like we will be going right into summer for the last week of May. YOU CAN NOW PAY YOUR WATER BILLS ONLINE! AT: WWW.PENDLETONNY.US

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT THE TOWN OF PENDLETON DOES NOT MAKE ADJUSTMENTS TO WATER/SEWER BILLS FOR SPRINKLER SYSTEMS OR THE FILLING OF SWIMMING POOLS.

Water/sewer bills are mailed out by the last Friday of January, April, July and October. If you do not receive your water bill by the end of the first week of the following month please contact the billing clerk at (716) 625-8833, ext. 111.

If you are selling your home you must first notify the water department at (716) 625-8033 as soon as possible to schedule a MANDATORY WATER LINE INSPECTION; and second notify the billing clerk at (716) 625-8833 ext. 111 with the date of your closing so that a final read can be scheduled. There is a \$50.00 fee for the inspection which only takes about 15 minutes to complete. Water bills are not forwarded, so you will need to provide us with your new mailing address as soon as possible.

Please remember that there is a surcharge for unpaid water/sewer balances levied to the Niagara County Tax Bill. Any balance remaining after 4:00 pm on Friday, September 18, 2020 will be assessed a \$100.00 surcharge! If this applies to you, a letter will be sent to you before the surcharge is assessed.

TOWN HISTORIAN

Between spiritual leader and intellectual is a space occupied by few. The veritable no man's land - a healer with one foot in the realm of Heaven and one on earth. This is a brief celebration of Father Laurence Bastian.

Laurence Joseph Bastian entered this world on July 15, 1858 to French parents in Bitschoffen, Alsace (which alternated, in ownership, between France and Germany courtesy of formal declarations such as the Treaty of Frankfurt in 1871 and the Treaty of Versailles in1919). His formative years were spent in France. During this time, he had found the path of the priesthood compatible with his life's mission.

His seminary years were spent in Cork, Ireland (presumably what is considered the Diocese of Cork and Ross) and the African Missions in Lyon, France. Laurence would have immersed himself in (for the better part of a decade): studying the bible, meditating on catechism, fasting and any other appropriate measure to prepare him for life as a clergyman. The hard work paid off when he was ordained a priest on July 26, 1884.

The newly christened Father Bastian was sent to the content of Africa. His focus were the inhabitants of Dahomey (a French territory; later Benin) who were notorius for their unpredictability. Despite bouts with malaria and diseases endemic to Dahomey, he found a common bond with the people. This resulted in the baptism of several thousand individuals. Their language, previously undocumented, he took careful strides to preserve (his books are currently housed in the British Library, the first of their kind).

In 1898, he was welcomed at the Diocese of Buffalo. In 1909, he replaced Father Fricker as head of Good Shepherd parish. Good Shepherd was Father Bastian's home for the next 18 years. Under his guidance, the parish blossomed. With a new coat of paint and a fully electrified viscera, Good Shepherd was relatively modernized by 1920. Father Bastian made it his duty to organize revenue to ensure the nuns and priests salaries were up to date. Between 1922 to 1926, all gutters lining the convent, rectory and parish were also replaced. Out with the old, in with the new - the original organ was sold and an electric one took its place by 1926. It was the crowning glory of its first concert (with a reception to follow)!

On a Tuesday morning (October 25, 1927), he was preparing himself for morning mass when apoplexy struck. He gave up the ghost. In the aftermath, he left behind two siblings (locally - abroad unknown) and was predeceased by his father, Joseph. The funeral celebrant was Father August Wiese (priest of St. Mary's, Lockport). His final resting place is in St. John Neumann's Cemetery at Good Shepherd Parish.

In closing, Padraig –Go raibh céad mile maith agat! A warm "thank you" to some unnamed individuals that aided in this endeavor and as always, the people of Pendleton (possibly beyond?) that have any questions, corrections or additions:

We are still able to process marriage licenses, parking permits for persons with disabilities, vendor permits, certified copies of birth, death and marriage certificates, dog licenses, water bill payments, etc. Some transactions can be completed online while others can be done by mail or drop-off at the Town Hall. (*Please note that a small convenience fee will be charged when making payments online.*) Please give the Town Clerk's office a call at 716-625-8833, ext. 110, if you have any questions.

At the time of this writing however, we are not able to issue sporting licenses. Customers can order or renew sporting licenses by calling the NYS DEC call center at 1-866-933-2257. When ordering through the call center, you will be given a transaction number which can be written down and used as a license or registration when fishing. Licenses can also be ordered online at https://decals.dec.ny.gov/DECALSCitizenWeb/ loginregister.htm. If licenses are ordered online, you will have the option to have a license sent by mail and/or email to print immediately. You will also have the option of writing down your transaction number for a fishing license or marine registry. Please contact the NYS DEC directly with any questions.


