From the Supervisor's Desk...

It's the time of year, once again when writing a check for January's property tax bill is fresh in everyone's memory and this year this happens to coincide with the start of a new refuse and recycling contract with Modern Disposal Services. The thought that runs through a lot of minds focuses on why are we paying such high property taxes, yet apparently receiving less services? Though I try to avoid boring people too much with discussion of how the Town receives revenue and budgets expenses, it's been awhile, so I believe recent circumstances warrant revisiting this topic.

First, on the side of revenue, the Town relies heavily on sources such as sales tax, meaning out of a projected \$4.1 million in budgeted revenue, about 35% is actually levied as property taxes. Please also keep in mind that whether your taxes are escrowed or you pay them directly yourself, combining your September school tax bill with your January Niagara County and Town tax bill, you do pay a lot of taxes. For example, my family paid a total of \$7,145, of which a total of \$629 was the Town's share, meaning roughly 12% of your annual property taxes goes directly to funding Town services. Please keep in mind that the revenue the Town receives covers emergency services (fire, rescue, EMS), Highway Department, Water & Sewer Department, refuse collection, and all Town Hall operations. A final note on revenue is that the Town Board has consistently kept the tax levy under the New York State imposed tax cap and the Town also has a top fiscal rating from the State. We all do pay a lot in property taxes, but the Town's share is small and used as efficiently as possible.

This now brings us to expenses and I'll specifically focus on refuse and recycling. Looking at my tax bills for the past five years I see that the refuse tax line was \$185 in 2015 and is \$180 for 2021. Facing rising costs associated with operating this program, the Town was able to purchase refuse totes at a low point in the commodities market, meaning a huge savings for taxpayers. Additionally, considering feedback

during the contract proposal process which took place last year, the cost of continuing with the current model of collection would have been considerably higher and would continue to rise over the coming years. The Town's move to tote collection, with four other towns comprising our consortium, joins the many other local municipalities who have done so in recent years for the same reasons.

As an aside, to put this in perspective, communities like Clarence and Hamburg do not offer a program like Pendleton's. In those towns residents are responsible for contracting their own service which easily costs over twice as much as the assessed cost in Pendleton. Residents of the Town of Elma have a transfer station, which means residents have to take their refuse and recycling for a ride as often as necessary for disposal. Considering the convenience and cost, the Town's program, in collaboration with a consortium of local municipalities, is a pretty good deal.

Looking at some of the changes, a big problem appears to be some confusion with the details of the changes and this is understandable. The changes were communicated in recent Town newsletters and by direct mailings from Modern, but we are all overwhelmed in our busy lives and I know reading the mail is pretty low on my to do list. That being said, everyone in the Town Hall and Public Works have been working hard to answer questions and help residents. Please do keep in mind that there is a link on the Town's website to the most recent collection schedule and information.

Going further into the details, some are concerned with the limitations of refuse and recycling totes. For families for whom one



recycling tote does not have enough capacity, you may purchase additional recycling totes by contacting Public Works. This has been the procedure since the beginning of the recycling program and there is no limit to the amount of recyclables you may place curbside, as long as all recyclables are in a tote. Around eight years ago I too had to purchase a second recycling tote as one was never enough.

Refuse tote capacity is another issue and for some, one large refuse tote is not enough. Each property owner may pay for up to three additional refuse totes at a cost of \$55 each per year. The refuse totes are provided at no cost, you are only paying for the cost of disposal of an additional 96 gallons of refuse each week for a year. If you do the math, that's \$55 for Modern to collect and haul away the equivalent of a large dump truck of refuse each year per tote, which again is a good deal.

This brings me to the final concern being that in the past each property owner used to be able to place six refuse cans curbside each week and now you're limited on the base service. It has been found that one 96 gallon refuse tote has plenty of capacity for the vast majority of families. To increase this base level of service EVERYONE would have to pay more. If you look around your neighborhood you'll see plenty of neighbors who only place a small bag curbside each week and typically these people are in the "retired" category. To increase the base level of service, a lot of people on fixed incomes who do not produce a lot of refuse would pay more. Instead, the refuse fee has remained flat and the cost of a higher level of service is covered by those who need more capacity. The Town Board did not feel it was appropriate to increase everyone's yearly cost \$50 to \$100 for a level of service most do not need or use.

In conclusion, I tried to put together as brief an overview of Town budgeting and the changes to the refuse and recycling contract as I could. If you have any further questions about these topics or others, please don't hesitate to contact your Town Board. Also, the Town's website is frequently updated with information. HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Hello, It's ironic for me to say it's been another long winter as I'm writing this article on February 24th and my truck temperature showed 57°.

As of today, it has been 2 long months for me watching roads. Only 3 mornings out of the last 60 I didn't get up at 3AM and check roads. Thanks to my deputy, Craig Walter, for covering those 3 days while I was out sick.

That being said, as Spring moves through, we transition our equipment from plowing & salting to road and drainage maintenance. As the snow melts away, I send the crew out to start repairing plow damage. Most times when we can do this late in the winter you'd hardly know any damage was done. Some of the areas will need topsoil and seed when the weather really turns nicer. We also repaired some mail boxes and there are a few we need to repair at a later date as well. If we don't get to you, please give us a call to make sure you are on the list.

Once Winter is completely over I will evaluate all of our roads and pick the best suited projects for the money appropriated in the budget. This year again it has been cut virtually in half, \$125,000 for 2020 and again \$125,000 for 2021. I would like to "finish" Dunnigan Road but it will depend on how all roads fare and the prices when they are bid out this Spring.

We also will need to watch over money set aside for off-road drainage ditches. Many of them need cleaning or recleaning but money and manpower will dictate which ones we can get to. For the most part we were able to get off-road last Fall to at least mow the weeds and brush to allow the Spring rains and snow-melt to drain away. There were a few roadside ditches that

we did not get to in the Fall. Basically, we mow the roadside ditches twice a year and off-road sometime late Summer.

A reminder to those of you with steel pipe in your roadside ditch and/or under your driveway: the steel is always deteriorating. Sooner or later it will completely rot away. It is the homeowner's responsibility to pay for the new "plastic" pipe when that time comes; the Town installs it on town roads. On county roads it is the same except Niagara County Department of Public Works does the work. On state roads the NY State Department of Transportation does not do any of this work. A few years ago, working with the Town Board, it was decided the Town would help out on state roads but only with driveway aprons. On town roads, subject to budget and priorities, we will also fill in your front ditch if you buy the pipe.

As usual, we try to get through the town chipping brush at least every 2 weeks. We typically **DO NOT chip brush from July 4th through Labor Day**, as this is the time we work on our roads and work with other towns on their roads. Please place your brush/branches and bushes in small manageable rows behind the shoulder line. As far as stumps, we do pick them up when we have some free time.

Due to COVID19, the opening of playgrounds and park shelters will be dependent on our ability to comply with NY State mandates. Please call the office as the weather gets nicer to check on the status.

FROM THE WATER/SEWER BILLING DEPARTMENT

Well we certainly cannot complain about our winter this year, with the exception of the February storm. Thank you Mother Nature! I just hope we don't have to pay for it when spring and summer roll around.

By the time you receive this newsletter Spring should be on its way, and hopefully it will be a nice one. Now would be a really good time to check your sump pumps to make sure they are in good working order, especially if you have water back-up pumps.

The next newsletter will not be until July, so I would like to remind you now that the Town of Pendleton **DOES NOT** make adjustments to water or sewer for sprinkler systems or for the filling of swimming pools.

In case you did not read the message on your January water bill, the Town now offers online bill pay for your water bills! We have had a lot of requests for this over the past few years, so thank you Debbie Maurer for making this available to our residents.

Payments made online will be considered received the day you make your payment. If you are currently paying through a third party payee, you may want to consider switching to the online bill pay to avoid any possibility of late charges.

During Tax Season, we have a lot of water bills going to the lockbox, which is only for Town Tax payments.

If you are using online bill paying with your personal bank you may need to create separate payees for water and taxes to ensure that the checks are being mailed to the correct address. Payments received late because they were mailed to the wrong address will be assessed a late charge.

If there is a case where I receive your water payment after the due date, and it was mailed on time, which will be verified by the official US postmark, I will waive the late charges automatically. Please be aware that a metered stamp **IS NOT THE SAME AS A US POSTMARK** and I will treat all metered stamps as being received 2 postal days prior, no earlier. Third party online bank payments **DO NOT HAVE A US POSTMARK** just a metered stamp, which may cause you to incur late fees if not received in a timely manner.

If you did not receive a water/sewer bill please be

advised that the following information is printed in each and every Newsletter:

Water/sewer bills are mailed out during the months of January, April, July and October. If you do not receive your water bill by the end of the first week of the following month please contact the billing clerk at (716) 625-8833, ext. 111.

Late charges are not waived just because you did not receive a bill. The billing schedule is in every quarterly newsletter and online at www.pendletonny.us.

If you are selling your home A **MANDATORY WATER LINE INSPECTION** is required before you close on the property. Please call (716) 625-8033 to schedule this water line inspection as soon as you list your property. There is a \$50.00 fee for the inspection, which only takes about 15 minutes, and you will be notified as to whether or not any work needs to be done before a compliance certificate can be issued.

In addition, you must notify the billing clerk at (716) 625-8833, ext. 111, as soon as your Attorney provides you with a closing date so that a final read can be scheduled.

TOWN OPERATIONS UPDATE

Over the past year the pandemic has affected many aspects of our lives and also Town operations. This includes closing of park areas, canceling the summer recreation program, closing Town offices, and more. Rules and regulations continue to change frequently and Town leaders work to ensure the health and safety of all while maintaining compliance.

Town Offices - As of March all Town offices are open by appointment only. All Town employees are hard at work, but we're being conservative in opening plans, deferring heavily to concerns of health and safety. Last September offices opened to the public, but we were forced to return to the "appointment only mode" in November when local infection rates increased. We anticipate opening the doors as soon as possible.

Summer Recreation Program - Options are being considered and current NYS guidelines are being evaluated. Once a decision has been made, information will be posted on the Town's website. Please keep in mind that changes from NYS, the Niagara County Department of Health, regional infection rates, and the

like could affect this program anytime between now and summer.

Open Meetings - In compliance with the Governor's Executive Orders, there have been a mix of open and closed meetings since early last year. All Town leaders are aware that our goal is to keep meetings open to the public as much as possible and at the moment all meetings are run in this manner. When local conditions deteriorate, we are forced to move to closed meetings with online streaming. Please know that the Town Board postpones any necessary public hearings during times that meetings are closed, as public input is important.

Town Park - There are currently no plans to close the Town Parks and facilities such as basketball and tennis courts. However, we are currently evaluating whether or not pavilions will be available for rentals this year. For updates related to this and other topics, please check the Town's website on a regular basis. Please be patient, keeping in mind that if facilities in the Town of Pendleton are closed or have limited access, you'll find the same conditions in most other local municipalities.

If you believe you might be eligible, please call the Assessor's office 625-8833 ext. 131 or 116. If this is your **FIRST** time applying for Enhanced Star, then you will do so through our office. If you are switching to the **Star Credit Check**, then you do so online at www.tax.ny.gov or by calling (518) 457-2036.







We here at the Fire Company are going with the flow as far as the Pandemic is concerned. Most of our usual gatherings, activities and efforts to fundraise involve larger crowds, we continue try to adapt our programs to the CDC and NY State Department of Health guidelines. Needless to say, most things are up in the air! The Easter Egg Hunt will not be held this year, BUT the Bunny may be seen riding on one of our engines on Saturday, April 3rd in the afternoons! Keep a lookout; watch our website—wendelvillefc.com—for updates.

We are trying to schedule a Sportsman's Night for the fall, no date set yet; we are working on making Lobsterfest take-out only; Harvest Moon 5K may be reworked to fit the guidelines. If it happens, the date would be Wednesday, September 8th. We will have our Annual Road Collection, as in other years.

We will wait to the very last minute to change the status of the 100th Anniversary Town Celebration in August and only if it is necessary!! Just like you, we are in the dark – inch by inch, day by day...we'll solve it!

There are important announcements that each resident of the Town of Pendleton should be aware of. It is included here...Wendelville Fire Company Makes Two Major Announcements for 2021...February 19, 2021 PENDLETON, N.Y. - The Wendelville Fire Company (WFC) announced today that two major improvements are being made to assist in fire suppression for the residents of Pendleton. This announcement comes as the WFC celebrates its 100th anniversary in 2021.

"Very shortly Wendelville will be breaking ground on a new Fire Hall and taking possession of a ladder truck" said Matthew Berry, Chief Officer of the Wendelville Fire Company. "Our Station two on Main Rd. will be replaced by a new four bay structure allowing for better response from the center of town and will also allow for the purchase of a piece of apparatus we are in need of, a ladder truck."

Wendelville will continue to operate out of three halls within town, each that will house an engine for quicker response times. The new hall on Main Road will replace the old outdated hall and will include four bays for apparatus, doubling in apparatus storage. "The Town of Pendleton is increasing in size daily and this new hall will allow us to keep up with the population increase regarding emergency operations" said Mark Walter, President, WFC.

Schneider Architectural Services of Buffalo, NY have designed this project for the WFC and the structure will encompass 5315-square-feet in total. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in August of this year with a completion date by the end of 2021.

The second announcement of adding a ladder truck to Wendelville's fleet is something that has become a necessity in the Town of Pendleton. "The construction of two hotels in our district, new home construction with steep roof pitches, metal roofs and homes with solar panels all create challenges for fire suppression" said Chief Berry. "Roof operations are dangerous for firefighters and the addition of a ladder truck to our fleet will allow our firefighters to conduct safer roof operations and rescue operations if the need arises" said President Walter.

Wendelville purchased a refurbished 2003 E-One 95' Mid Mount Platform truck from Brindlee Mountain Fire Apparatus of Union Grove, AL. This truck was previously in service in Kansas and will help serve the Town of Pendleton at a fraction of the cost of a new ladder truck. "Why buy new when used will do" said Richard Misztal, Third Assistant Chief. "New ladder trucks cost in excess of one-million dollars today; this truck will allow us to protect our residents and firefighters at a fraction of the cost."

The ladder truck is currently being refurbished and is scheduled for delivery in early May. "Training will be our number one focus prior to placing the truck into service" said Shawn Christman, First Assistant Chief. "Our firefighters will receive specialized training for this piece of equipment and we will be placing it into service this summer."

With Wendelville celebrating 100 years of service in 2021 these two projects will make this year one for the history books in many ways. Wendelville is a unique fire company because they service the entire Town of Pendleton, all 27 square miles and are the only local emergency service provider for the town, creating the slogan "One Town, One Company." Please be aware that both projects have been entered into with forethought and much planning. Questions should be addressed to Mark Walter, President or to Joe Riester, Vice President. 

PENDLETON TOWN HISTORIAN

Guard Gate 18, the ancient colossus which towers above the Erie Barge Canal at Bear Ridge Road, is a sight familiar to most Pendletonians. A favorite point of plunge for teenagers during the sultry days of summer, it stands at an impressive 43 feet.

The original sluice gate dismantled, the Empire Engineering Corporation was given the task to begin the construction of a modern lock on August 6, 1908. It took several years to complete.

This gate, like its siblings, is vital to the regulation and proper flow of the canal. Each season presents a new challenge. Throughout the year, employees keep periodic vigil over the guard gate and canal. During the winter, the guard gate is closed for repairs. Each spring, right around April, an operator mans the concrete counterweights from a small control house nearby. The process is gradual (up to 15 inches at a time). This helps to ensure the water distributes evenly for miles.
