#### FROM THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Good news, there will be an increase in our funding from the NY State Consolidated Local Street & Highway Improvement Program this year. We will be assessing all our town roads to determine what can be done with the new budget. Currently we are working on drainage inlets and gutter curbs in several subdivisions.

#### **BRUSH COLLECTION**

Due to limited manpower, this year we will be able to get through the town to chip brush only once a month.

## WE DO NOT CHIP BRUSH FROM JULY 4<sup>TH</sup> TO LABOR DAY

All brush must be placed neatly in piles that our town workers can safely pull apart. Brush should be sticking out butt end at the road and no bigger than 6 inches in diameter. Stretch the piles out rather than stacking them too high for the safety of our workers. We do not chip brush that contains vines nor poison ivy.

The town does not chip brush that comes off of vacant lots nor wooded areas. Please be advised that this service is provided for yard clean up purposes.

When you hire a contractor to come in and remove a tree or limbs, it is the responsibility of the contractor to chip and remove the tree and/or limbs properly.

#### ASSESSMENT NEWS

Hello, Tentative Roll Day of May 1<sup>st</sup> has passed and 'The BAR', Board of Assessment Review has met to review homeowners that contested their assessments. Any adjustments from now on will be considered for the 2022 roll. Final Roll will be submitted on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 and the school, town and county taxes will be based on the established assessments.

There has been some chatter on social media networks that Pendleton has changed everybody's assessment because of a town wide market update. A reval has not happened, is not scheduled or even being discussed at this time. The usual course of assessed value adjustments is in place but only on places that had a change over the last year. So if your property hasn't changed, your AV hasn't changed either.

I feel this present cycle is unsustainable and will crash and burn out soon. This anomalous situation has all of the hallmarks of a "bubble" and will end poorly. Mother Nature has been a little confused this year as we did not get the April showers until the beginning of May. I was hoping for a nice long spring but with the 80 degree temperatures we are having this week, looks like summer is here to stay.

REMEMBER YOU CAN NOW PAY YOUR WATER BILLS ONLINE AT:

WWW.PENDLETONNY.US when you get to the homepage, just look to the left for: Pay your water bill online!

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT THE TOWN OF PENDLETON DOES NOT MAKE ADJUSTMENTS TO WATER/SEWER BILLS FOR SPRINKLER SYSTEMS OR THE FILLING OF SWIMMING POOLS.

Water/sewer bills are mailed out by the last Friday of January, April, July and October. If you do not receive your water bill by the end of the first week of the following month please contact the billing clerk at (716) 625-8833, ext. 111.

If you are selling your home you must first notify the water department at (716) 625-8033 as soon as possible to schedule a **MANDATORY WATER LINE INSPECTION**; and second notify the billing clerk at (716) 625-8833 ext. 111 with the date of your closing so that a final read can be scheduled. There is a \$50.00 fee for the inspection which only takes about 15 minutes to complete. Water bills are not forwarded, so you will need to provide us with your new mailing address as soon as possible.

Please remember that there is a surcharge for unpaid water/sewer balances levied to the Niagara County Tax Bill. Any balance remaining after 4:00 pm on Friday, September 17, 2021 will be assessed a \$100.00 surcharge! If this applies to you, a letter will be sent to you before the surcharge is assessed.

#### PENDLETON TOWN HISTORIAN



Van Slyke is a surname mentioned frequently in old Pendleton records. The family is considered founding members of the community. In fact, the first marriage to take place in the town of Pendleton (at the, town of Niagara) was between James Van Slyke and Margaret Cristman in 1816. Van Slyke Pater Familias, Cornelise, arrived

on the ship Eendracht in 1634. Like many Dutchmen, he settled in the Great Albany area. In addition to tradesman, he was fluent in the Mohawk tongue and became an interpreter for its nation. This won him the heart of a certain maiden named Ots-Toch. Their son, Jacques or Itsychosaquacka, born at the Mohawk settlement in Canajoharie. He, too, was an interpreter for the tribe.

Garret Van Slyke, great grandson of Jacques, was a young POW during the American War for Independence. Sir William Johnson, the British superintendent of Indian Affairs, and his common law wife, or Molly Brant (older sister of the illustrious Chief) took Garret to their humble abode for a life of servitude. In a twist of fate, an uncle purchased him back for a gallon of rum. As an adult, Garret and his wife, along with their three children settled in Pendleton in 1822.

#### PENDLETON HISTORICAL SOCIETY

We had our second meeting on May 17 with a great speaker, David Batterson, a historian from Springville. He is involved in preserving town buildings and records and has authored a few books about Springville. Did you know that Springville was once called Fiddler's Green and there is a Springville connection with the Great Race of 1908?

Come to our next meeting on June 21 and find out more history in our area. The meeting will start at 6pm with a hot dog roast. Bring your own side dish, no sharing, with covid precautions still in place.

In July and August we will be at the Pendleton Farmers Market selling our popcorn and books. We will have signups for this and also for the Wendleville Fireman's picnic on August 14. We will sell our sausages, hot dogs, and popcorn just like we did on May 15<sup>th</sup> with the Pendleton Vets and their flag sale. So if you did not get any of these delicious summertime treats come to the Firemans picnic.

Our new building is still in the planning stagesbut it is a GO!!! Come and support us. Dues are \$10 a year. This will be our last scheduled meeting till September. Thanks, Janet Karnes, Vice president Garret passed away just two years later. His son, John, lived in Pendleton for the rest of his years (left this mortal coil at the ripe age of 92). The first town clerk named in May 1827 was Garret Van Slyke (presumably a nephew of the original). Alvin Van Slyke, grandson of Garret and Anna, passed away in an unfortunate accident securing sweets for a Church social in his 60s.

Friends, Romans, Countrymen - lend me your ears! As always, your town historian is delighted with your enthusiasm concerning the interest in history around us. First and foremost, I'd like to thank the helping hands (and inquiring minds) of a small group of helpers. A 'thank you' to Lorine McGinnis Schulze for the picture of the Slyke family bible (pictured left) (which was found on Ebay and returned to its rightful owner!) She is a descendent of the Van Slykes and an impressive scholar pertaining to her family's history. Another shout out to Mr. Raymond Ball concerning his prowess with records.

#### MOVING ON FROM THE PANDEMIC


Niagara County is waiting for federal funds through the American Rescue Plan to help our community recover

from the pandemic. We are expecting roughly \$40 million over the next two years and these funds must be used for very specific purposes. I am a firm believer that these funds must be directed to rebuild our economy, help businesses recover and get people back to work. This is especially true n helping our small businesses who really are the backbone of our economy.

Niagara County government took several steps during the pandemic — furloughs, early retirement incentive, budget modifications — to mitigate lost revenue. This allowed us to pass another budget that stayed underneath the property tax cap while still providing the services the public expects.

As we look forward, I believe it's also important to take a look back and appreciate the heroic efforts of heath care workers, first responders, essential workers and everyone who was on the front lines to keep our community safe. Thank you to all of these folks and our residents as well for the sacrifices that were made to get us through this.

Niagara County DPW will undertake a safety review of Bear Ridge Road at Tonawanda Creek. We know many of you have expressed concerns about the intersection. DPW will review traffic flow, look at how the road configuration measures up to NYS design standards and then present alternatives.

#### PENDLETON CONSERVATION ADVISORY COUNCIL

As we spend time out in our gardens and yards in the spring and summer, or enjoy Pendleton's trails and parks, we get the chance to see many native trees and flowers. These native species not only help reduce carbon dioxide in the air, they support native bees, butterflies, birds, and other animals who live alongside us. However, there are other species whose presence is not so welcome. They are known as invasive species. Here are a few you should look out for in your area:

Purple Loosestrife: This plant has beautiful purple flowers, but its rapid spread has led to major destruction in wetlands and loss of native wildlife. Seeds are easily dispersed if the plant is handled, so if you see it in your area, please contact the WNY PRISM (web address found at the end of the article) for more information on removal.

Common Reed (Phragmites): These are a common sight in ditches and wetlands throughout Pendleton. Tall grass with a light brown feathery top, this species outcompetes native species like cattails and forms monocultures in wetlands. This leads to declines in native wildlife and changes in local hydrology, as well as a fire hazard in the form of built up dead grass.

Japanese Knotweed: This shrub was brought to the US in the 19th century for ornamental gardening purposes, but due to its high adaptability and network of roots which can survive for decades, it has invaded most of the state of New York. It grows extremely fast and can outcompete other species for sunlight. Once it becomes established, it is difficult to remove, and can be extremely destructive to ditches, pavement, and flood control infrastructure. Again, please contact the WNY PRISM for details on how to remove.

Giant Hogweed: This plant is actually hazardous to your health! If you see one, DO NOT TOUCH IT! If you brush against it, it will release a sap that will cause burns to your skin within 24 to 48 hours. It looks a little like Queen Anne's Lace (they are both from the carrot family) but is far taller (up to 14 feet) and larger. If you come into contact with this plant, wash the affected skin with soap and water and keep the area away from direct sunlight for 48 hours. If you suspect that giant hogweed is on your property or in a nearby area, please call the NY DEC's Giant Hogweed Information Line: 845-256-3111. Detailed directions to the plant infestation (GPS coordinates and street address a plus) and estimate of the number of plants will help the DEC to find and remove the plants.

An outline of initiatives that have been accomplished recently to keep the association on mission follows:


