




I am formally announcing my plan to retire on Dec 31, 2022, as Pendleton Town Justice. I would like to thank my wife, Marian, Joel Maerten, Town Supervisor, Town Board, Town of Pendleton residents, and the entire Town Hall Staff past and present for their support over the last 23 years. Town Supervisors, Town Boards, current co-judge, Kevin Mack, amazing court clerks Patricia Dickinson, Barbara Ricotta, James Rotella, and retired Judges have been very helpful in carrying out my responsibilities as Town Justice. Their Cooperation and assistance have been fully appreciated.

A judge once wrote about what it meant to be a judge. Being temperate under circumstances that would try the patience of the most serene. Being respectful to those who show no respect, being civil to those who act uncivil, using judicial power sparingly and with restraint, all while using your mind, intellect, and heart to weigh competing interests, analyzing the rule of law, deciding the facts, and searching for just conclusions. I have fully appreciated this experience and forever will reflect on it.

Over the years I have been successful in acquiring grants for court facility updating, technology, and equipment improvements. I have accumulated considerable data over the years, numerous files, and architectural drawings supporting a new courtroom facility. I have shared this work with my co-judge, Kevin Mack for him to continue these efforts.

I thank all my supporters for their trust and confidence in me throughout my career as Town Justice and my wife Marian for her never-ending support. Marian and I will be visiting grandchildren and family, and forever watch Pendleton grow as a community on the canal.

TOWN CLERK



Hello. I would like to start by providing a brief update of the mailed tax payment issue that occurred in January. The U.S. Postal Service lost important mail that was postmarked January 4th, January 10th and January 18th. The mail was eventually

located by the USPS but not until after multiple residents made duplicate payments to avoid late payment penalties. At that time, it was uncertain if the USPS would ever find the missing mail. If you were affected by this issue and need to file a claim with the USPS, please contact my office for more information. We will provide you with a local phone number to file a claim. The USPS provided a letter extending its "most sincere apologies in regards to the error which occurred during the sorting process". All I can say is that this caused quite a disruption in the tax collecting process this year. I want to thank all involved for their patience while we figured this out.

On a happier note, we plan on implementing a direct payment withdrawal option for your water bill. Those interested will need to submit an authorization form. I expect to have this ready to roll by the next water billing cycle and will be posting the forms and additional information soon on our website so stay tuned!

Registration for the Summer Youth Recreation Program will be handled in the Town Clerk's office and is expected to begin in early May. I hope to have registration forms available online soon. More to come!

FROM THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Hi, for those that do not know me, my name is David Fischer and I am the new Highway Superintendent. I am very excited to begin this new journey serving the town of Pendleton.

I would first like to thank Craig Walter and Carl Gross for all their dedication and hard work over their many years of employment with the town. Craig and Carl both retired on January 1^{st,} 2022. Luckily for me, Craig has stayed on part time as my Highway Deputy and working to get me up to speed. It would otherwise have been much more difficult for me, thank you Craig.

My first order of business was finding workers to replace our departed staff. I am pleased to say we found two well qualified people in Josh Hubbell and Kieran Hickman who both started in January.

BRUSH COLLECTION

Weather permitting, we will be chipping brush once a month throughout the town. WE DO NOT CHIP BRUSH FROM JULY 4TH TO LABOR DAY.

All brush must be placed neatly in piles that our town workers can safely pull apart. Brush should be sticking out butt end at the road no bigger than 6 inches in diameter. Stretch the piles out rather than stacking them too high for the safety of our workers. We do not chip brush that contains vines nor poison ivy.

The town does not chip brush that that comes off vacant lots nor wooded areas. Please be advised that this service is provided for yard clean up purposes only. When you hire a contractor to come in and remove a tree or limbs, it is the responsibility of the contractor to chip and remove the tree and/or limbs properly.

Park shelters are open to town residents for \$25 and can be reserved by calling the DPW at 716-625-8033.

In closing, I would like to thank all the employees in the Department of Public Works for their efforts in keeping the roads clear of snow and fire hydrants accessible. They work tirelessly throughout the night to keep our roads safe, and it is very much appreciated.



CONSERVATION ADVISORY COUNCIL

Greetings from your Conservation Advisory Council! Springtime is fast approaching, and that means that soon the weather will be nice enough to be out preparing our gardens for planting. When you're making plans for your gardens this year, please consider adding a mix of native plants in with the other annuals and perennials you'll be planting.

Why choose native plant varieties? According to the US Department of Agriculture, they provide the following benefits:

They don't require fertilizers and require fewer pesticides They require less water and can help prevent erosion They can help reduce air pollution

They provide shelter and food for wildlife, and attract bees and butterflies to your garden

They promote biodiversity and stewardship of our country's natural heritage

They are beautiful!

Here are suggestions for some (out of many!) species you might consider:

Purple coneflower (*Echinacea purpurea*) is a perennial with large, showy purple blossoms. It prefers well-drained soils, sun and partial shade, and attracts bees and hummingbirds.

Common milkweed (*Asclepias syriaca*) is a perennial with spherical sprays of small white and light pink or purple blossoms. It prefers full sun and moist soil, and is a critical food source for butterflies.

Swamp milkweed (*Asclepias incarnata*) is a perennial with spherical sprays of small pink blossoms. It prefers sun and partial shade and moist or wet soils, and is a critical food source for monarch caterpillars.

Great Blue Lobelia (Lobelia siphilitica) is a perennial with columns of showy blue flowers. It can live in sun, partial shade, and shade, and prefers moist or wet soils. It is a favorite of pollinators and especially important to bumblebees.

Bottlebrush grass (*Elymus hystrix*) is a perennial grass that has three dimensional seedheads that look a bit like bottlebrushes. It prefers sun to partial shade and dry to moist soils. It is usually found in woodlands and attracts butterflies.

Wild blue phlox (*Phlox divaricata*) is a commonly seen perennial wildflower on our roadways and fields that is starting to be edged out by purple loosestrife (an invasive species). It has loose clusters of lavender and pink flowers and attracts many varieties of butterflies. It prefers shade and moist, acidic soils.

Buffalo Niagara Waterkeeper also has a guide to native species available on their website (https://bnwaterkeeper.org/projects/nativeplantguide/) for a small donation. If you would like to grow these or other native species in your garden, there are a few places you can purchase them. Local nurseries and garden stores may have some varieties. Urban Roots, a garden store in Buffalo, propagates native species for sale. North Tonawanda Botanical Garden also propagates some species for sale at a springtime fundraiser. If you're interested in native trees and bushes, Niagara Country Soil and Water Conservation District has a tree sale every winter that offers a wide variety of species.

We hope this has been helpful to you and wish you a joyous springtime and gardening season!

REMINDER

If you move from your primary residence in Pendleton it is your obligation to notify the Assessor's office. Each residence that is receiving the Star Exemption signed the Star application acknowledging that they would notify the Assessor of their change in residency.

Please remember all exemptions are due by March 1st. If you will be turning 65 in 2022 you may be eligible for the Enhanced Star. If you believe you might be eligible please call the Assessor's office 625-8833 ext. 131. If this is your FIRST time applying for Enhanced Star, then you will do so through our office. If you are switching to the **Star Credit Check**, then you do so online at www.tax.ny.gov or by calling (518) 457-2036.

Anyone receiving the Enhanced Star including Aged exemption recipients must now be Enrolled in the mandatory New York State Income Verification Program (IVP) ****IF YOUR TOTAL TAXABLE/NON-TAXABLE INCOME IS \$30,000 OR LESS, PLEASE CONTACT OUR OFFICE AS YOU MAY BE ENTITLED TO THE AGED EXEMPTION****

Each year, not long from now, the gardens will be tilled for another impending harvest. This is a careful process and each lot of land demands a different approach for an optimal yield. How many people have examined the contents of the soil?

Since my youth, dear reader, I have eagerly awaited the latest discovery. Of what? You might ask. The usual – old marbles, glass, metal and any bit of rubbish that paints a picture of yesteryear. This gives us, the observer, a glimpse into the past. It is rare to find most things as a whole but entirely common to find them in fragments. A small child might

find a trinket worth pocketing only to proudly show an adult later. What did we find? A couple noteworthy items. A piece of Forest Green depression glass (which was a missing piece to a nearly complete set), a couple marbles and some mercury dimes. How much does the Forest Green depression set fetch? It depends on the vendor but noted range is from \$25 to \$250. How about the 1920s mercury dimes? That's slightly more involved. If it was in circulation one might expect a little over \$3. A specimen that was previously uncirculated can fetch as much as \$150.

This spring as you rejuvenate your soil and prepare for the season, please be mindful of what you might dig up especially if it pertains to the town of Pendleton. You just never know!


