From the Supervisor's Desk...

You can certainly tell that we're transitioning from spring to summer, through the change in weather and by seeing the increased activity of all sorts around town. From roadside ditching to whipping the parks into shape, crews have finally been able to put the snow plows away and focus on other tasks. News from the Building Department tells me that people are being optimistic and planning a lot of summer work. Hopefully, we'll all have a long, pleasant, and productive summer season.

As I opened by mentioning parks, I'll provide a quick update on multiple ongoing projects that are moving forward. Work continues on the community center plans, as we are hoping to soon have bidding documents ready to advertise for bids. If it seems like I've been providing the same update on this project for a while now, you're probably right. One thing that most do not appreciate is the amount of time and effort that a government entity must spend "jumping through hoops" when planning a capital project.

Two other projects in the works are the Town's grants for parks improvements and a new lavatory facility. Again, we are moving these projects along as quickly as we can, but the approval process with folks in Albany is a methodical and sometimes time consuming endeavor. The long term vision is that a year from now we'll start seeing all these plans come together with significant change to the Town park.

One change that you will see soon is the

construction of a new salt storage barn adjacent to the Public Works facility. To give you an idea of the amount of time projects such as this take, I believe it's been at least two years since the Town received initial approval of the grant application submitted to fund the new salt barn and an emergency backup generator for public works. However, when the work is complete, this project will greatly assist crews in snow removal and will provide uninterrupted power for public works when extreme weather events affect the power grid.

With the increase in temperature comes the predictable increase in concern for traffic safety. The Town's new key law enforcement officer, Deputy Kroening, has been busy making his rounds about town as well as enforcing the law. If you have any concerns you'd like to share with him, feel free to send an email to PendletonDeputy@pendletonny.us. I always tell people to include as many specific details as possible to assist him in addressing your issue. I can rattle off a long list of the Town Board's accomplishments during my time in office, but I can say the work with the Niagara County Sheriff's Office leading to having a full-time deputy is at the top of the list.

Finally, I'd like to thank everyone who has been hard at work on the Town's baseball and softball program, summer recreation, the Pendleton Station Market, and the Farm & Home Days. If I missed something, I apologize. All appreciate the efforts of dedicated and energetic volunteers. Please watch the Town's website for up-to-date information.



FROM THE WATER/SEWER BILLING DEPARTMENT

Well, winter is finally behind us and April was nothing but spring showers so here we are in the second week of May with record temperatures already! Fortunately, it will go back to normal next week... normal?

REMEMBER YOU CAN NOW PAY YOUR WATER BILL ONLINE AT:

WWW.PENDLETONNY.US when you get to the homepage, just look to the left for: ONLINE PAYMENT PORTAL click on View or Pay Your Water Bill Here, then enter your account number and pin number.

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT THE TOWN OF PENDLETON DOES NOT MAKE ADJUSTMENTS TO WATER/SEWER BILLS FOR SPRINKLER SYSTEMS OR THE FILLING OF SWIMMING POOLS.

Water/sewer bills are mailed out by the last Friday of January, April, July and October. If you do not receive your water bill by the end of the first week of the following month please contact the billing clerk at (716) 625-8833, ext. 111.

If you are selling your home, you must first notify the water department at (716) 625-8033 as soon as possible to schedule a MANDATORY WATER LINE INSPECTION; and second notify the billing clerk at (716) 625-8833 ext. 111 with the date of your closing so that a final read can be scheduled. There is a \$50.00 fee for the inspection which only takes about 15 minutes to complete. Water bills are not forwarded, so you will need to provide us with your new mailing address as soon as possible.

Please remember that there is a surcharge for unpaid water/sewer balances levied to the Niagara County Tax Bill. Any balance remaining after 4:00 pm on Friday, September 16, 2022 will be assessed a \$100.00 surcharge! If this applies to you, a letter will be sent to you before the surcharge is assessed.

Please remember all the men and women in our Armed Forces, past and present.





FROM THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Hi Everyone! The Town Highway Department has been busy cleaning front ditches on Mapleton Road to help with drainage. As soon as the off-road ditches are dry enough on Mapleton Road, we will be mowing and cleaning out the silt. Those ditches, along with many other off-road ditches are in serious need of attention. As weather permits, the Highway Department will be addressing as many as possible this year to help alleviate some of the road flooding.

This year we have received our funding from the CHIPS program (New York State Consolidated Local Street and Highway Improvement Program). We will determine what would be the best way to use the funds for road repair along with what is already in our road budget. Current plan is to mill and pave Oakwood from Campbell Blvd to Meadow Brook Drive. We are also planning to do a couple of smaller road jobs.

BRUSH COLLECTION - As in past practice, we will not chip brush from **JULY 4**TH **TO LABOR DAY.** Please remember to place brush with butt ends out, no larger than 6" diameter, and not stacked higher then 2 to 3 feet.

PARKS - We were finally able to get on the baseball diamonds to get them ready for the season. With such a wet spring it made it very difficult but our Highway Department along with the Water & Sewer Department were up to the task. I want to thank them all for putting forth the extra effort to get the job done. Also, both Public Work Departments worked together to replace the roof on the park bathroom which was in poor shape.

In August the new, larger salt building will be going up to replace the out of date shed we now have. We will be blacktopping a large pad behind the town garage where the new building will be placed. All these projects would not be possible without the teamwork we have in the Public Works Department including the office staff.

NEWS FROM NIAGARA COUNTY By Legislator Tony Nemi

The National Association of Counties runs a program called "Why Counties Matter" to help people better

understand where counties fit into the overall government scheme. Residents interact with their local town government from time to time and they are well aware of what goes on in Albany and Washington, but county government is often a bit of a mystery.

The fact is counties play the role of delivering a wide range of services to our residents. Some of these are state mandated. Others are programs that are specifically tailored to our community. We also have an important policy role which begins with protecting "home rule" – meaning that the government closest to the people should have more decision-making authority than bureaucrats hundreds of miles away. So with this in mind, let me do a quick update on a bunch of different items of interest from our county departments:

Our Office for the Aging is once again serving lunches for seniors at the Pendleton Center United Methodist Church on Campbell Blvd. The lunches are served every Monday at noon. There is no charge for the meals, but those who can are encouraged to make a voluntary contribution. There are additional activities as well so I hope our seniors will take advantage of this great program.

A reminder from Niagara County Clerk Joe Jastrzemski to pistol permit holders they must re-certify every five years with the New York State Police. That means those who either received their permit or recertified in 2017 must now recertify by the date of issuance on their permit. Those who need to re-certify should go to the State Police recertification website at https://safeact.ny.gov/pistol-permit-recertification.



I am very excited that all the funding is now in place for a new training facility for the Niagara County Law Enforcement Academy (NCLEA) to be built at NCCC. The County Legislature allocated up to \$3 million dollars from American Rescue Funds to match the state contribution for the facility. Plans for the new 15,000 square-foot building call for four classrooms with movable walls, men's and women's locker rooms, a reality-based training room, and a use-of-force simulator. It is anticipated that construction will start in the spring 2023, and the facility will open in 2024. There is no better investment we can make than supporting the training of our future law enforcement officers.

Last, I hope everyone is taking full advantage of the many amenities that can be found in our county parks, including West Canal Marina right here in Pendleton. Across our five park system, you can find splash pads, playgrounds, hiking trails, boat launches, picnic shelters and even an internationally ranked disc golf course. That's right, the Bond Lake Disc Golf Course at Burmaster Park was recently rated as the 41st best course in the world, on the list for the 2nd year in a row. And that was out of over 10,000 rated courses. Building on that success, we are opening a new disc golf course at Royalton Ravine Park this summer.







PENDLETON TOWN HISTORIAN

"To move the world we must move ourselves." - Socrates

The migration to New York State, in particular the territory that would later become Pendleton, was a popular move for the individuals and families of sturdy New England stock. These people were often descended from roguish sea captains, career military gentlemen and against the grain clergymen. The inherent desire to risk life and limb for a new homestead certainly lived up to the popular Latin phrase *Audentes Fortuna Juvat*—Fortune favors the bold.

The Andrus (Andrews) family fit the description perfectly. Originally from Connecticut, the Andrus's found Niagara County an auspicious spot to call home. Warren Andrus (wife Eliza, briefly mentioned in records) and his young son, George, settled in the area of the old Wort farm in 1838. In the 1897 biographical work, Landmarks of Niagara County NY by William

Pool, there is a brief mention of the Andrus's (a certain W.C. Andrus settling in the area shortly before it was christened Pendleton in 1824).

George married a woman named Mary. The 1880 census lists Mary's parents as English by birth and her birthplace as New York. Their daughter, Lillie, would marry a certain John H. Warren. Like their parents before them, John was a farmer and Lillie was a housewife. John and Lillie were the parents of Gertrude L. Warren (pioneer of the modern 4H movement). Their farm was located on Meyer road. (Photo credited to the illustrious Cindy from Find A Grave).

REMINDER

If you move from your primary residence in Pendleton it is your obligation to notify the Assessor's office. Each residence that is receiving the Star Exemption signed the Star application acknowledging that they would notify the Assessor of their change in residency.

Please remember **all** exemptions are due **by March 1**st. If you will be turning 65 in 2020 you may be eligible for the Enhanced Star. If you believe you might be eligible please call the Assessor's office 625-8833 ext. 116. If this is your **FIRST** time applying for Enhanced Star, then you will do so through our office. If you are switching to the **Star Credit Check**, then you do so online at www.tax.ny.gov or by calling (518) 457-2036.

Anyone receiving the Enhanced Star including Aged exemption recipients must now be Enrolled in the <u>mandatory</u> New York State Income Verification Program (IVP)
